21	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2021, Section 650.4, is
22	amended to read as follows:
23	Section 650.4 A. Every person who, without justifiable or
24	excusable cause and with intent to do bodily harm, commits any

B. As used in this section, "medical care provider" means 7 doctors, residents, interns, nurses, nurses' aides, ambulance 8 9 attendants and operators, paramedics, emergency medical technicians, laboratory technicians, radiologic technologists, physical 10 therapists, physician assistants, chaplains, volunteers, 11 12 pharmacists, nursing students, medical students and, members of a hospital security force, and any other employees working in or for a 13 health care facility or independent contractors in one of the listed 14 15 categories.

16 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2021, Section 650.5, is 17 amended to read as follows:

Section 650.5 A. Every person who, without justifiable or excusable cause and with intent to do bodily harm, commits any aggravated assault and battery or any assault with a firearm or other deadly weapon upon the person of a medical care provider, upon conviction, is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for a term not less than two (2) years nor more than five (5) years, or by a fine not to

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1 exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by both such fine and 2 imprisonment.

B. As used in this section, "medical care provider" means
doctors, residents, interns, nurses, nurses' aides, ambulance
attendants and operators, paramedics, emergency medical technicians,
laboratory technicians, radiologic technologists, physical
therapists, physician assistants, chaplains, volunteers,
pharmacists, nursing students, medical students and, members of a
hospital security force, and any other employees or independent

11SECTION 3.AMENDATORY63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-114.3, is12amended to read as follows:

Section 1-114.3 A. Every hospital, health clinic and ambulance 13 service shall display at all times in a prominent place a printed 14 sign with a minimum height of twenty (20) inches and a minimum width 15 of fourteen (14) inches, with each letter to be a minimum of one-16 fourth (1/4) inch in height, which shall read as follows: 17 WARNING: ASSAULTING A MEDICAL PROFESSIONAL WHO IS ENGAGED IN THE 18 PERFORMANCE OF HIS OR HER OFFICIAL DUTIES IS A SERIOUS CRIME. 19 Section 650.4 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 20

B. Every hospital, health clinic and ambulance service shall
report by January 31 all assaults for the prior year on all medical
care providers in the facility, on facility property, or while
performing duties in an official capacity to the State Department of

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1	Health on an annual basis without any identifying information
2	regarding the individual who was assaulted or who committed the
3	assault. The following data shall be provided to the Department:
4	1. An aggregate number of individuals assaulted annually;
5	2. The type of assault, either verbal, physical, and/or sexual;
6	3. Role of the perpetrator, either coworker, patient, or
7	patient's family; and
8	4. Location of the assault.
9	The State Department of Health shall have rulemaking authority to
10	implement the provisions of this section.
11	C. The <u>State</u> Department of Health shall not make public any
12	identifiable information in regard to facility, individual or
13	location of assaults, if such information is received. The
14	Department shall publish on its website, on an annual basis,
15	aggregate numbers for the data collected pursuant to subsection B of
16	this section.
17	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
