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8	An Act relating to higher education; creating the Oklahoma Opportunity Scholarship Act; providing short
9	title; defining terms; creating the Oklahoma Opportunity Scholarship Program; providing purpose of
10	program; providing for award amount; providing eligibility criteria for program; providing retention
11	eligibility criteria for program; providing for promulgation of rules; providing for calculation of
12	scholarship program award to be allocated from certain fund; directing benefits to be awarded to
13	certain eligible applicants subject to availability of funding and the number of eligible applicants;
14	directing the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education to make awards on certain basis if certain
15	funds are insufficient; allowing the State Regents to take into consideration certain grants and
16	scholarships; prohibiting award from being allowed for certain courses or units taken after certain
17	period of time; allowing award for certain courses or units taken after certain period of time under
18	certain circumstances; allowing the State Regents to set aside certain funds for certain full commitment;
19	directing priority to be given to certain continued support; providing for calculation of financial need;
20	amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3953.1, which relates to the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund;
21	updating statutory language; expanding use of fund for certain purpose; providing for codification;
22	providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
2	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
3	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2500 of Title 70, unless there
4	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
5	A. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
6	Opportunity Scholarship Act".
7	B. As used in this act:
8	1. "CTP program" means a degree, certificate, or nondegree
9	program that meets each of the following criteria:
10	a. is offered by an institution of higher education or
11	technology center school,
12	b. is delivered to students physically attending the
13	institution of higher education or technology center
14	school,
15	c. is designed to support students with intellectual
16	disabilities who are seeking to continue academic,
17	career and technical, and independent living
18	instruction at an institution of higher education or
19	technology center school to prepare for gainful
20	employment,
21	d. includes an advising and curriculum structure,
22	e. requires students with intellectual disabilities to
23	participate on not less than a half-time basis as
24	determined by the institution of higher education or

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technology center school, with such participation focusing on academic components and occurring through one or more of the following activities:

- (1) regular enrollment in credit-bearing courses with nondisabled students offered by the institution of higher education or technology center school,
- 7 (2) auditing or participating in courses with
  8 nondisabled students offered by the institution
  9 for higher education or technology center school
  10 for which the student does not receive regular
  11 academic credit,
  - (3) enrollment in noncredit-bearing, nondegreecourses with nondisabled students, or
    - (4) participation in internships or work-based training in settings with nondisabled students,
- f. requires students with intellectual disabilities to be 16 socially and academically integrated with nondisabled 17 students to the maximum extent possible, and 18 is approved by the United States Department of 19 q. Education pursuant to P.L. No. 110-315, the Higher 20 Education Opportunity Act, as amended; 21 2. "Eligible student" means a student with an intellectual 22

23 disability who is eligible for the scholarship program;

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3. "Scholarship program" means the Oklahoma Opportunity
 Scholarship Program;

4. "State educational institution" means a higher education
institution or technology center school supported wholly or in part
by direct legislative appropriations that provides a CTP program;

6 5. "State Regents" means the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher7 Education; and

"Student with an intellectual disability" means a student: 6. 8 9 a. with a cognitive impairment, characterized by significant limitations in intellectual and cognitive 10 functioning and adaptive behavior as expressed in 11 12 conceptual, social, and practical adaptive skills, and b. who is currently or was formerly eligible for a free 13 appropriate public education under the Individuals 14 with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), including a 15 student who was determined eligible for special 16 education or related services under IDEA but attended 17 a private school or was educated pursuant to the other 18 means of education exception provided for in 19 subsection A of Section 10-105 of Title 70 of the 20 Oklahoma Statutes. 21

C. There is hereby created a program to be known as the Oklahoma Opportunity Scholarship Program. The purpose of the program is to provide an award to eligible students with

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1 intellectual disabilities who are pursuing studies in this state at 2 a CTP program. The award shall be an amount equal to the 3 nonguaranteed resident tuition at an institution of higher education 4 or the tuition at a technology center school.

5 D. A student with an intellectual disability shall be eligible6 for the Oklahoma Opportunity Scholarship Program if the student:

Is a resident of this state or enrolled in a school district
located in this state that serves students who reside in both this
state and an adjacent state pursuant to a contract authorized by
Section 5-117.1 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

Is a United States citizen or lawfully present in the United
 States. A student who is not a United States citizen or lawfully
 present in the United States shall not be eligible to participate in
 the scholarship program and qualify for an award;

15 3. Has graduated within the previous six (6) years from a 16 public high school accredited by the State Board of Education or a 17 private school, or has satisfactorily completed within the previous 18 six (6) years an educational program that was provided through a 19 means other than a public or private school;

4. Has secured admission to and enrolled in a CTP program at an
educational institution that meets the requirements to be eligible
for federal student financial aid; and

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5. Has established financial need according to the provisions
 of Section 3 of this act and standards and provisions promulgated by
 the State Regents.

4 E. To retain eligibility in the scholarship program, a student5 with an intellectual disability shall:

Meet the requirements for retention and completion as
 established by the state educational institution where the student
 is enrolled;

9 2. Maintain satisfactory academic progress as required by the10 CTP program criteria;

Comply with the standards related to maintenance of
 eligibility as promulgated by the State Regents; and

Refrain from conduct that leads to expulsion or suspension
 of more than one semester from a state educational institution. A
 student who violates the provisions of this paragraph shall
 permanently lose eligibility for scholarship program benefits.

F. The State Regents shall promulgate rules relating to the establishment and maintenance of eligibility under the scholarship program.

20 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2501 of Title 70, unless there 22 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Subject to the availability of funds, an amount equivalentto the nonguaranteed resident tuition at an institution of higher

elucation or the tuition at a technology center school for which an eligible student is obligated at a CTP program shall be awarded by allocation from the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund created pursuant to Section 3953.1 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

B. Benefits awarded through the scholarship program shall be 6 awarded to all eligible student applicants without any limitation on 7 the number of awards in any year other than the amount of funds 8 9 available for the scholarship program and the number of eligible 10 student applicants. Subject to the provisions of subsection C of this section, if funds are not sufficient to provide awards for all 11 12 eligible student applicants, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall make awards on the basis of need. Provided, the 13 State Regents may take into consideration other grants and 14 scholarships received by an eligible student applicant when making 15 awards. 16

C. An award provided for by this section shall not be allowed for courses or other postsecondary units taken more than five (5) years after the eligible student's first semester of postsecondary enrollment. The State Regents may award the scholarship program benefits for courses or other postsecondary units taken more than five (5) years after the eligible student's first semester of postsecondary enrollment only in hardship circumstances; provided,

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however, no eligible student may receive benefits beyond a
 cumulative time period of five (5) years.

3 D. The State Regents may, at the time an award is made on behalf of an eligible student, set aside in the Oklahoma Higher 4 5 Learning Access Trust Fund funds for the full commitment made to the student. For all academic years, students who have previously 6 received awards under the provisions of the Oklahoma Opportunity 7 Scholarship Act and who have continued at all times to fulfill the 8 9 requirements for eligibility to receive awards provided pursuant to 10 the scholarship program shall be given an absolute priority for continued financial support by the scholarship program above any 11 12 students who are applying for an award for the first time.

13 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2502 of Title 70, unless there 15 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Except as otherwise provided for in subsection B of this 16 Α. section, a student with an intellectual disability shall not be 17 found to be in financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma 18 Opportunity Scholarship Act if prior to receiving any scholarship 19 program award for any year during which the student is enrolled in a 20 CTP program at a state educational institution, the federal adjusted 21 gross income of the student's parent(s) or legal guardian(s) exceeds 22 One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) per year. 23 The determination of financial qualification provided in this subsection 24

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1 shall be based on the income of the student, not the income of the 2 parent(s) or legal guardian(s), if a student is determined to be 3 independent of his or her parent(s) or legal guardian(s) for federal 4 financial aid purposes.

5 в. 1. A student with an intellectual disability who was adopted between birth and twelve (12) years of age while in the 6 permanent custody of the Department of Human Services, in the court-7 ordered custody of a licensed private nonprofit child-placing 8 9 agency, or federally recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child Welfare Act, shall not be found to be in 10 financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Opportunity Scholarship 11 12 Act if prior to receiving any scholarship program award for any year during which the student is enrolled in a CTP program at a state 13 educational institution, the federal adjusted gross income of the 14 student's parent(s) exceeds One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars 15 (\$150,000.00) per year. 16

2. A student with an intellectual disability who was adopted 17 between thirteen (13) and seventeen (17) years of age while in the 18 permanent custody of the Department of Human Services, in the court-19 ordered custody of a licensed private nonprofit child-placing 20 agency, or federally recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the 21 federal Indian Child Welfare Act, shall not be found to be in 22 financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Opportunity Scholarship 23 Act if prior to receiving any scholarship program award for any year 24

1 during which the student is enrolled in a CTP program at a state 2 educational institution, the federal adjusted gross income of the 3 student's parent(s) exceeds Two Hundred Thousand Dollars 4 (\$200,000.00) per year.

5 3. The determination of financial qualification provided for in 6 this subsection shall be based on the income of the student, not the 7 income of the student's parent(s), if the student is determined to 8 be independent of the student's parent(s) for federal financial aid 9 purposes.

10SECTION 4.AMENDATORY70 O.S. 2021, Section 3953.1, is11amended to read as follows:

Section 3953.1. A. There is hereby created a trust fund to be known as the "Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund". The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall be the trustees of <del>said</del> the Trust Fund.

B. The State Regents shall utilize said the Trust Fund to implement the provisions of Sections 2601 through 2605 of this title and Sections 1 through 3 of this act.

C. The Trust Fund principal shall consist of monies the Legislature appropriates or transfers to the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education for the Trust Fund and any monies or assets contributed to the Trust Fund from any other source, public or private. All monies accruing to the credit of said the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the State

Regents. Expenditures from said the fund shall be made upon
 warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as
 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and
 Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

5 D. Notwithstanding other provisions of law, income and investment return on Trust Fund principal shall accrue to the Trust 6 Fund for use as provided by authorization of the trustees for the 7 purposes provided in Sections 2601 through 2605 of this title and 8 9 Sections 1 through 3 of this act. The State Regents may also 10 utilize the Trust Fund principal for the purposes provided in Sections 2601 through 2605 of this title and Sections 1 through 3 of 11 12 this act. Except as otherwise provided by law, no such income or investment return or principal shall be used for administrative 13 expenses; expenses incurred by the State Regents in the 14 administration of the Trust Fund and of the Oklahoma Higher Learning 15 Access Program established by the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access 16 Act and the Oklahoma Opportunity Scholarship Program established by 17 the Oklahoma Opportunity Scholarship Act shall be paid from monies 18 appropriated to the State Regents coordinating board for their 19 general operating budget. 20

E. The <u>State</u> Regents shall adopt rules for accomplishing
transfer of funds from the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust
Fund to the appropriate institutional Educational and General
Operations Revolving Funds, as provided in Section 3901 of this

1	title, to private institutions, and to the appropriate technology
2	center school district to cover general enrollment fees or tuition
3	for eligible students pursuant to the Oklahoma Higher Learning
4	Access Act and the Oklahoma Opportunity Scholarship Act.
5	Allocations from the Trust Fund may be made only for the purpose of
6	covering the general enrollment fees or tuition of eligible
7	students. No portion of the Trust Fund may be used or allocated for
8	administrative or operating expenses of any higher education
9	institution or technology center school.
10	SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
11	SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
12	of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
13	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
14	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
