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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-103.15 of Title 70, unless
18	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	A. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
20	Science Education Act".
21	B. The State Board of Education, school district boards of
22	education, school district superintendents, and school principals
23	shall endeavor to create an environment within public school
24 23	districts that encourages students to explore scientific questions,

¹ learn about scientific evidence, develop critical thinking skills, ² and respond appropriately and respectfully to differences of opinion ³ about controversial issues.

4 C. The State Board of Education, school district boards of 5 education, school district superintendents, and school principals 6 shall endeavor to assist teachers to find effective ways to present 7 the science curriculum as it addresses scientific controversies. 8 Teachers shall be permitted to help students understand, analyze, 9 critique, and review in an objective manner the scientific strengths 10 and scientific weaknesses of existing scientific theories covered in 11 the course being taught using evidence-based, peer-reviewed 12 material.

D. Neither the State Board of Education, nor any school
district board of education, school district superintendent, or
school principal shall prohibit any teacher in a public school
district in this state from helping students understand, analyze,
critique, and review in an objective manner the scientific strengths
and weaknesses of existing scientific theories covered in the course
being taught using evidence-based, peer-reviewed material.

E. The provisions of this section shall only protect the teaching of scientific information and shall not be construed to promote any religious or non-religious doctrine, promote discrimination for or against a particular set of religious beliefs

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1 or non-beliefs, or promote discrimination for or against religion or 2 non-religion.

F. By no later than the start of the 2023-2024 school year, the State Department of Education shall notify school district boards of education and school district superintendents of public schools in this state of the provisions of this act. Each school district board of education and school district superintendent shall notify all employees within the school district of the provisions of this act.

10 A teacher as defined by Section 1-116 of Title 70 of the G. 11 Oklahoma Statutes who complies with the provisions of this act shall 12 be granted immunity from civil liability or termination of 13 employment for acts described in subsection C of this section. 14 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023. 15 SECTION 3.
