6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to public health and safety; creating  
8 the First Responders Job Protection Act; defining  
9 terms; requiring first responders to report passive  
10 drug exposure; requiring reports of passive drug  
11 exposure be provided to medical review officer;  
12 providing for codification; and providing an  
13 effective date.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-539.11 of Title 63, unless  
17 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "First  
19 Responders Job Protection Act".

20 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-539.12 of Title 63, unless  
22 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

23 As used in this section:  
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1 1. "Controlled dangerous substance" means a drug, substance or  
2 immediate precursor in Schedules I through V of the Uniform  
3 Controlled Dangerous Substances Act or any drug, substance or  
4 immediate precursor listed either temporarily or permanently as a  
5 federally controlled substance;

6 2. "First responder" means an individual who performs emergency  
7 medical services on scene in accordance with the Oklahoma Emergency  
8 Response Systems Development Act and rules of the State Board of  
9 Health promulgated thereto;

10 3. "Passive exposure" means when an individual is exposed to a  
11 controlled dangerous substance without actually ingesting or using  
12 the substance himself or herself; and

13 4. "Volunteer" means a person who enters into a service or  
14 undertaking of the person's free will without compensation or  
15 expectation of compensation in money or other thing of value in  
16 order to provide a service, care, assistance, advice, or other  
17 benefit; provided, being legally entitled to receive compensation  
18 for the service or undertaking performed shall not preclude a person  
19 from being considered a volunteer.

20 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-539.13 of Title 63, unless  
22 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

23 A. The first responder or volunteer first responder subject to  
24 drug testing shall verbally report, to the first responder's agency

1 or private employer prior to testing, any specific known potential  
2 passive exposure to any controlled dangerous drug that has occurred  
3 in the previous fourteen (14) days while responding to an emergency.

4 B. In the event of a positive drug test, the medical review  
5 officer shall be provided with documentation of the verbal report  
6 and a subsequent written report provided by the responding agency in  
7 order to rule out passive exposure.

8 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.

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
