## 1 STATE OF OKLAHOMA 2 1st Session of the 59th Legislature (2023) HOUSE BILL 2600 3 By: Humphrey 4 5 6 AS INTRODUCED 7 An Act relating to the Agriculture Investigative Services Unit; transferring the Agriculture Investigative Services Unit to the Oklahoma State 8 Bureau of Investigation; transferring personnel, 9 funds, records, encumbrances, equipment, and other items; providing requirements pertaining to the 10 transfer of employees; providing for the transfer of administrative rules; requiring the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry to 11 abolish the Unit within the Department after completion of transfer; providing for transition 12 coordinators and a transition team; providing duties 1.3 of the transition team; creating the Agriculture Crime Division within the Oklahoma State Bureau of 14 Investigation; stating purpose of division; providing for the promulgation of rules; repealing 2 0.S. 2021, Section 6-310, which relates to agriculture 15 investigation and agriculture law enforcement agents; 16 providing for codification; and providing an effective date. 17 18 19 20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 2.1 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-310.1 of Title 2, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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A. Effective November 1, 2023, all powers, duties and responsibilities of the Agriculture Investigative Services Unit, a division within the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry, shall be fully transferred from the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry.

- B. All assets, funds, liabilities, allotments, purchase orders, outstanding financial obligations, encumbrances, records, vehicles, equipment, and other property of the Agriculture Investigative

  Services Unit are hereby transferred to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation.
- C. Personnel employed by the Agriculture Investigative Services Unit on November 1, 2023, shall be transferred to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation pursuant to a transition plan implemented by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry and the Agriculture Investigative Services Unit as required by Section 2 of this act.
- D. The employees who are transferred pursuant to this section shall be subject to the following provisions:
- 1. All employees who are transferred pursuant to this act shall retain leave, sick and annual time earned, and any retirement and longevity benefits which have accrued during their employment with the state. The salaries of employees who are transferred shall not be reduced as a direct and immediate result of the transfer;

- 2. If the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation should implement a reduction in force, all employees transferred pursuant to this act shall be credited for the time they were employed by the Agriculture Investigative Services Unit; and
- 3. The transfer of personnel shall be coordinated with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.
- E. Effective November 1, 2023, any administrative rules promulgated by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry related to the administration of the Agriculture Investigative Services Unit and any other administrative rules related to agricultural investigations in Oklahoma shall be transferred to and become part of the administrative rules of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation. The Office of Administrative Rules in the Office of the Secretary of State shall provide adequate notice in the Oklahoma Register of the transfer of rules, and shall place the transferred rules under the Administrative Code section of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation.
- F. The Director of the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture,
  Food, and Forestry shall abolish the Agriculture Investigative
  Services Unit within the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food,
  and Forestry after such transfer has been completed.

- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-310.2 of Title 2, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. The Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, the Director of the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry and the Director of the Agriculture Investigative Services Unit shall serve as transition coordinators and shall establish a transition team to coordinate the orderly transfer of duties, personnel, property, funds, and encumbrances from and consolidation of the Agriculture Investigative Services Unit to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation. Each Director may assign personnel to the transition team as deemed necessary.
  - B. The transition team shall:

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- 1. In conjunction with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services, oversee and administer the orderly transfer of responsibilities, assets, funds, liabilities, allotments, purchase orders, vehicles and other property, records, personnel and any outstanding financial obligations or encumbrances to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation from the Agriculture Investigative Services Unit;
- 2. Review functions currently assigned to or managed by the Agriculture Investigative Services Unit and the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation;

3. Establish a plan for the transfer of employees from the Agriculture Investigative Services Unit to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation. The plan shall include a list of positions to be transferred. The plan also shall include a reduction-in-force plan and a severance benefits plan that conform with the requirements of the State Government Reduction-in-Force and Severance Benefits Act; and

- 4. Take such other action as may be reasonably necessary and appropriate to effectuate the orderly transition of functions as provided by this act.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 165.5 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. There is hereby created the Agricultural Crime Division within the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation. The purpose of the division shall be to address issues related to crime related to agriculture in Oklahoma including, but not limited to, enforcing the civil, criminal, and administrative provisions relating to livestock theft, animal health and importation statutes and theft of farming equipment and farm implements, as well as any other law contained in the Oklahoma Agricultural Code.
- B. The Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation shall adopt and promulgate such rules as may be necessary to carry out the duties of the Agricultural Crime Division.

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SECTION 4. REPEALER 2 O.S. 2021, Section 6-310, is
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   hereby repealed.
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       SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
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
