11	An Act relating to the Oklahoma Health Care Authority; requiring that portions of certain
12	appropriated funds be used for certain purposes; directing Oklahoma Health Care Authority to implement
13	increased payment for certain long-term care and intermediate care facilities for individuals with
14	intellectual disabilities; directing the Authority to distribute funds to certain institutions; requiring
15	the Authority to work with certain association to create the methodology for disbursement; requiring
16	submission of certain plan by certain date; providing for duties and compensation of administrators and
17	employees; authorizing payment of certain expenses; authorizing certain transfers; requiring certain
18	transfers; authorizing certain early transfer requests; authorizing the exemption of unanticipated
19	federal funds from expenditure and budgetary limitations; providing procedures; requiring certain
20	budget procedures; prohibiting certain budget procedures; and providing lapse dates.
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23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
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SECTION 1. From the funds appropriated to the Oklahoma Health Care Authority in Enrolled House Bill No. 1004 of the 1st Extraordinary Session of the 59th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Thirty Million Dollars (\$30,000,000.00) shall be used to provide grant funding to providers for the one-time connection to the statedesignated entity for health information exchange.

SECTION 2. From the funds appropriated to the Oklahoma Health 7 Care Authority in Enrolled House Bill No. 1004 of the 1st 8 9 Extraordinary Session of the 59th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of 10 Forty-seven Million Seven Hundred Sixty-seven Thousand Four Hundred Fifty-eight Dollars (\$47,767,458.00) shall be used to increase 11 12 reimbursement to long-term care facilities by Thirty-five Dollars (\$35.00) per day and reimbursement to intermediate care facilities 13 for individuals with intellectual disabilities (ICF/IID) by 14 Seventeen Dollars (\$17.00) per day. 15

16 SECTION 3. A. From the funds appropriated to the Oklahoma 17 Health Care Authority in Enrolled House Bill No. 1004 of the 1st 18 Extraordinary Session of the 59th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of 19 Two Hundred Million Dollars (\$200,000,000.00) shall be used for one-20 time funding to critical access hospitals and hospitals 21 participating in the Supplemental Hospital Offset Payment Program.

B. The Authority shall work in conjunction with an Oklahomabased association of hospitals to create the methodology for the
disbursement of this funding.

C. The Authority shall submit to the Senate Appropriations
 Committee Chair and the House of Representatives Appropriations and
 Budget Committee Chair a plan for the disbursement of the funds
 listed in this section by no later than July 31st, 2023.

5 SECTION 4. A. The duties and compensation of employees, not 6 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed 7 upon the Oklahoma Health Care Authority by law shall be set by the 8 Administrator of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority.

9 B. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority is authorized to:
10 1. Pay professional expenses of the Administrator of the
11 Authority including dues, licenses, professional memberships, and
12 continuing education classes conducted in this state; and

13 2. Pay professional expenses of any employee including dues, 14 licenses, professional memberships, continuing medical education 15 classes conducted in this state, and medical malpractice insurance 16 provided he or she is a full-time employee of the Authority in 17 accordance with subsection B of Section 5006 of Title 63 of the 18 Oklahoma Statutes and is utilizing those professional skills in the 19 performance of his or her job duties.

20 SECTION 5. In order to facilitate cash management of federal 21 grant receipts and disbursements, the Office of Management and 22 Enterprise Services shall transfer monies between the Oklahoma 23 Health Care Authority federal and revolving funds in amounts 24 requested by the Oklahoma Health Care Authority.

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SECTION 6. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority is authorized to
 transfer funds from Fund 205 and Fund 270 to Fund 200 and Fund 340
 to satisfy claims made to the Authority under the Supplemental
 Hospital Offset Payment Program Act.

5 SECTION 7. The Administrator of the Oklahoma Health Care 6 Authority may request, in the manner provided in this section, that 7 receipt and expenditure of unanticipated federal funds awarded after 8 July 1, 2023, be exempt from expenditure limitations and from 9 budgetary limitations.

The Administrator shall make a request for exemption to the
 Office of Management and Enterprise Services in writing and file a
 revised budget program.

2. The Administrator shall also file copies of the request for 13 exemption and budget work program revisions with the Senate 14 Appropriations Committee Chair and the House of Representatives 15 Appropriations and Budget Committee Chair. The Senate 16 17 Appropriations Committee Chair and/or the House Appropriations and Budget Committee Chair shall notify the Office of Management and 18 Enterprise Services of any noncompliance of the request with 19 legislative intent within twelve (12) calendar days of receipt of 20 the exemption request. The Office of Management and Enterprise 21 Services shall approve the request for exemption unless both the 22 Chair and Vice Chair of the Legislative Oversight Committee on State 23 Budget Performance provide written notification to the Office of 24

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1 Management and Enterprise Services within twelve (12) calendar days of the Committee's receipt of the exemption request that the 2 exemption subverts the intention and objectives of the Legislature 3 in establishing the original limit. The Office of Management and 4 5 Enterprise Services shall give written notice of approval or disapproval of each exemption to the agency, the Governor, the Chair 6 of the Senate Appropriations Committee, and the Chair of the House 7 Appropriations and Budget Committee within eighteen (18) calendar 8 9 days of receiving the request.

The Director of the Office of Management and 10 SECTION 8. A. Enterprise Services shall transfer monies appropriated from the 11 General Revenue Fund and the Health Care Enhancement Fund to the 12 13 Oklahoma Health Care Authority disbursing funds in the amounts and ratios requested by the Authority, except that the cumulative 14 amounts transferred shall not exceed the cumulative amounts of equal 15 monthly allotments of the appropriations from the General Revenue 16 Fund and Health Care Enhancement Fund. 17

B. Monies appropriated or collected for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, may be transferred to these disbursing funds for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, to satisfy encumbrances and obligations of such fiscal year; provided, that monies equal in amount are transferred from appropriations or collections for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, to the disbursing fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, to satisfy encumbrances and

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obligations of such fiscal year. All transfer requests shall be in
 writing to the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
 Services.

4 C. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority shall maintain records of5 the inter-year transfers.

6 SECTION 9. The Administrator of the Oklahoma Health Care 7 Authority may request, through the Director of the Office of 8 Management and Enterprise Services, the early transfer by the 9 Oklahoma Tax Commission of tax collections to the General Revenue 10 Fund for the purpose of early allocation to the agency's disbursing 11 funds to alleviate cash-flow problems.

SECTION 10. Appropriations made by Enrolled House Bill No. 1004 12 of the 1st Extraordinary Session of the 59th Oklahoma Legislature, 13 not including appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may 14 be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024 (hereafter FY-15 24), or may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025 16 (hereafter FY-25). Funds budgeted for FY-24 may be encumbered only 17 through June 30, 2024, and must be expended by November 15, 2024. 18 Any funds remaining after November 15, 2024, and not budgeted for 19 FY-25, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then 20 current fiscal year. Funds budgeted for FY-25 may be encumbered 21 only through June 30, 2025. Any funds remaining after November 15, 22 2025, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then 23 current fiscal year. These appropriations may not be budgeted in 24

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1	both fiscal years simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-24, and not
2	required to pay obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted
3	for FY-25, after the agency to which the funds have been
4	appropriated has prepared and submitted a budget work program
5	revision removing these funds from the FY-24 budget work program and
6	after such revision has been approved by the Office of Management
7	and Enterprise Services.
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
