Supp. 2022, Section 1141.1), which relates to 12 retention of taxes and fees; modifying certain fee retention by licensed operators; repealing 47 O.S. 13 2021, Section 1132.5, which relates to additional registration fees; providing an effective date; and 14 declaring an emergency. 15 16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 17 47 O.S. 2021, Section 2-147, is 18 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY amended to read as follows: 19 20 Section 2-147. Α. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a fund to be designated as the "State Public Safety Fund". 21 The fund shall be subject to legislative appropriation and shall 22 consist of revenues deposited to such fund by Section 1113.2 of 23 24

Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes and of such other revenues as may
 be provided by law.

B. The State Public Safety Fund shall be utilized by the
Legislature through appropriations to support public safety in
Oklahoma and the services offered by Service Oklahoma.

6 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 282, O.S.L.
7 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 3-101), is amended to read as
8 follows:

9 Section 3-101. <u>A.</u> Service Oklahoma, a division of the Office
10 of Management and Enterprise Services, is hereby created, which
11 shall consist of the <u>Executive</u> Director of Service Oklahoma and such
12 divisions, sections, committees, offices, boards, and positions as
13 may be established by the <u>Executive</u> Director of Service Oklahoma or
14 by law.

The applicable powers, duties, and responsibilities exercised by the Driver License Services Division of the Department of Public Safety shall be fully transferred to Service Oklahoma on November 1, 2022. All employees of the Department of Public Safety whose duties are transferred under this act shall be transferred to Service Oklahoma.

The applicable powers, duties, and responsibilities exercised by the Motor Services Division of the Oklahoma Tax Commission shall be fully transferred to Service Oklahoma on January 1, 2023. All

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1	employees of the Oklahoma Tax Commission whose duties are
2	transferred under this act shall be transferred to Service Oklahoma.
3	B. 1. Beginning November 1, 2023, Service Oklahoma shall cease
4	to be part of or a division of the Office of Management and
5	Enterprise Services and shall be deemed to be a separate and
6	distinct agency, to be known as Service Oklahoma. Service Oklahoma
7	and the Director of Service Oklahoma shall continue to exercise
8	their statutory powers, duties, and contractual responsibilities.
9	All records, property, equipment, assets, monies, financial
10	interests, liabilities, matters pending, and funds of the division
11	shall be transferred to Service Oklahoma.
12	2. Service Oklahoma shall succeed to any contractual rights or
13	responsibilities incurred by the Office of Management and Enterprise
14	Services pertaining to licensed operators.
15	3. Rules promulgated by the Office of Management and Enterprise
16	Services pertaining to Service Oklahoma that are in effect on the
17	effective date of this act shall be immediately adopted and enforced
18	by the Executive Director of Service Oklahoma. The Executive
19	Director maintains the authority to further promulgate and enforce
20	<u>rules.</u>
21	4. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services and Service
22	Oklahoma may enter into an agreement for the transfer of personnel
23	from the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to Service
24	Oklahoma. No employee shall be transferred to Service Oklahoma

1	except on the freely given written consent of the employee. All
2	employees who are transferred to Service Oklahoma shall not be
3	required to accept a lesser grade or salary than presently received.
4	All employees shall retain leave, sick, and annual time earned, and
5	any retirement and longevity benefits which have accrued during
6	their tenure with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.
7	The transfer of personnel between the state agencies shall be
8	coordinated with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.
9	5. The expenses incurred by Service Oklahoma as a result of the
10	transfer required by this subsection shall be paid by Service
11	Oklahoma.
12	6. The division within the Department known as Service Oklahoma
13	shall be abolished by the Office of Management and Enterprise
14	Services after the transfer has been completed.
15	7. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall
16	coordinate the transfer of records, property, equipment, assets,
17	funds, allotments, purchase orders, liabilities, outstanding
18	financial obligations, or encumbrances provided for in this
19	subsection.
20	SECTION 3. AMENDATORY Section 3, Chapter 282, O.S.L.
21	2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 3-103), is amended to read as
22	follows:
23	Section 3-103. A. The <u>Executive</u> Director of Service Oklahoma
24	shall be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of

the Senate. The <u>Executive</u> Director shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor and may be removed or replaced without cause. Compensation for the <u>Executive</u> Director shall be determined pursuant to Section 3601.2 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The <u>Executive</u> Director may be removed from office by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members elected to and constituting each chamber of the Oklahoma Legislature.

B. The <u>Executive</u> Director of Service Oklahoma shall be the
chief executive officer of Service Oklahoma and shall act for
Service Oklahoma in all matters except as may be otherwise provided
by law. The powers and duties of the <u>Executive</u> Director shall
include, but not be limited to:

Organize Service Oklahoma in a manner to efficiently achieve
 the objectives of Service Oklahoma;

15 2. Supervise all activities of Service Oklahoma;

3. Administer programs and policies of Service Oklahoma;
4. Employ, discharge, appoint, contract, and fix duties and
compensation of employees at the discretion of the <u>Executive</u>
Director;

20 5. Appoint assistants, deputies, officers, investigators,
21 attorneys, and other employees as may be necessary to carry out
22 functions of Service Oklahoma;

23 6. Prescribe rules and regulations for the operation of Service24 Oklahoma;

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7. Provide input and recommendations to the Service Oklahoma
 Operator Board on all matters including branding and physical
 standardization requirements, customer service metrics, analysis,
 and improvement processes for licensed operators, and processes for
 termination of licensed operators for failure to comply with the
 customer service metrics;

8. Establish internal policies and procedures;

9. Prescribe and provide suitable forms deemed necessary to
9 carry out the functions of Service Oklahoma and any other laws the
10 enforcement and administration of which are vested in Service
11 Oklahoma;

12 10. Establish such divisions, sections, committees, advisory 13 committees, offices, and positions in Service Oklahoma as the 14 <u>Executive</u> Director deems necessary to carry out the functions of 15 Service Oklahoma;

16 11. Accept and disburse grants, allotments, gifts, devises,
17 bequests, funds, appropriations, and other property made or offered
18 to Service Oklahoma; and

19 12. Create the budget for Service Oklahoma to be submitted to20 the Legislature each year.

C. The salary and other expenses for the <u>Executive</u> Director
shall be budgeted as a separate line item through the Office of
Management and Enterprise Services <u>Service Oklahoma</u>. The operating
expenses of Service Oklahoma shall be set by the <u>Executive</u> Director

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and shall be budgeted as a separate line item through the Office of
 Management and Enterprise Services Service Oklahoma.

The Executive Director of Service Oklahoma shall direct 3 D. 1. all purchases, hiring, procurement, and budget for Service Oklahoma 4 5 of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services and establish, implement, and enforce policies and procedures related thereto, 6 consistent with the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act. Service 7 Oklahoma and the Executive Director shall be subject to the 8 9 requirements of the Public Competitive Bidding Act of 1974, the Oklahoma Lighting Energy Conservation Act, and the Public Building 10 Construction and Planning Facilities Act. 11

12 2. The Executive Director of Service Oklahoma, or any employee or agent of the Executive Director of Service Oklahoma acting within 13 the scope of delegated authority, shall have the same power and 14 authority related to purchases, hiring, procurement, and budget for 15 Service Oklahoma as outlined in paragraph 1 of this subsection for 16 17 Service Oklahoma as the State Purchasing Director has for all acquisitions used or consumed by state agencies as established in 18 the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act. Such authority shall, 19 consistent with the authority granted to the State Purchasing 20 Director pursuant to Section 85.10 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma 21 Statutes, include the power to designate financial or proprietary 22 information submitted by a bidder confidential and reject all 23 requests to disclose the information so designated, if the Executive 24

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Director of Service Oklahoma requires the bidder to submit the financial or proprietary information with a bid, proposal, or quotation.

4 <u>E. Service Oklahoma shall determine the compensation to be</u>
5 retained by licensed operators.

1. Before the last day in September in every even-numbered 6 year, Service Oklahoma shall review the compensation paid to 7 licensed operators and, if necessary, change the compensation. 8 9 Service Oklahoma shall engage an independent third party to evaluate 10 the compensation paid to licensed operators who shall provide any 11 recommendations no later than November 1 in the even-numbered year. 12 Any recommended change in licensed operator compensation shall be 13 finalized by Service Oklahoma no later than the third Tuesday of November in the even-numbered year. Notice of such recommendation 14 shall be provided to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore and the 15 Chair of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate, and the Speaker 16 and the Chair of the Appropriations and Budget Committee of the 17 18 House of Representatives. 2. Any change in licensed operator compensation, unless 19 rejected or amended as provided by this subsection, shall become 20 effective on July 1 of the following calendar year. Any amendment 21 passed by a majority vote of each house of the Legislature shall 22

- 23 <u>become effective as provided by the amendment unless vetoed by the</u>
- 24 <u>Governor</u>.

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1 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY Section 6, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 3-106), is amended to read as 3 follows:

Section 3-106. Α. There is hereby created in the State 4 5 Treasury a revolving fund for Service Oklahoma to be designated the "Service Oklahoma Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing 6 fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations. All monies accruing 7 to the credit of said the fund are hereby appropriated and shall be 8 9 budgeted and expended by Service Oklahoma for the restricted 10 purposes of the monies as prescribed by law. Expenditures from said the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer 11 12 against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the 13 Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment. 14

There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving 15 В. fund for Service Oklahoma to be designated the "Service Oklahoma 16 17 Reimbursement Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations. All monies accruing to the 18 credit of said the fund are hereby appropriated and shall be 19 budgeted and expended by Service Oklahoma for the restricted 20 purposes of the monies as prescribed by law. Expenditures from said 21 the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer 22 against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the 23

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Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and
 payment.

There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving 3 С. fund for Service Oklahoma, to be designated the "Service Oklahoma 4 5 Computer Imaging System Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund not subject to fiscal year limitations. All monies 6 accruing to the credit of said the fund are hereby appropriated and 7 shall be budgeted and expended by Service Oklahoma for the purpose 8 9 of implementing, developing, administering, and maintaining the 10 computer imaging system of Service Oklahoma. Expenditures from said the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer 11 12 against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the 13 Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment. 14

D. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving 15 fund for Service Oklahoma to be designated the "Licensed Operator 16 17 Performance Fund". This fund shall be a continuing fund not subject to fiscal year limitations. All monies accruing to the credit of 18 the fund are hereby appropriated and shall be budgeted and expended 19 by Service Oklahoma for the restricted purposes of the monies as 20 prescribed by law. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon 21 warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as 22 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and 23 Enterprise Services for approval and payment. 24

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<u>1. The Licensed Operator Performance Fund shall be distributed</u>
 <u>to licensed operators in accordance with the applicable metrics</u>
 determined by Service Oklahoma.

<u>2. In the event that excess funds exist in the Licensed</u>
<u>Operator Performance Fund after distribution to licensed operators</u>
<u>pursuant to this subsection, the remaining funds are authorized to</u>
<u>be expended for the purpose of purchasing back a licensed operator</u>
<u>license from a licensed operator, pursuant to Section 1140 of this</u>
title.

10 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-101, as 11 last amended by Section 37, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 12 2022, Section 6-101), is amended to read as follows:

13 Section 6-101. A. No person, except those hereinafter expressly exempted in Sections 6-102 and 6-102.1 of this title, 14 shall operate any motor vehicle upon a highway in this state unless 15 the person has a valid Oklahoma driver license for the class of 16 17 vehicle being operated under the provisions of this title. No person shall be permitted to possess more than one valid license at 18 any time, except as provided in paragraph 4 of subsection F of this 19 section. 20

B. 1. No person shall operate a Class A commercial motor
vehicle unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and
holds a valid Class A commercial license, except as provided in
paragraph 5 of this subsection and subsection F of this section.

Any person holding a valid Class A commercial license shall be
 permitted to operate motor vehicles in Classes A, B, C and D, except
 as provided for in paragraph 4 of this subsection.

2. No person shall operate a Class B commercial motor vehicle
unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and holds a
valid Class B commercial license, except as provided in paragraph 5
of subsection F of this section. Any person holding a valid Class B
commercial license shall be permitted to operate motor vehicles in
Classes B, C and D, except as provided for in paragraph 4 of this
subsection.

3. No person shall operate a Class C commercial motor vehicle unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and holds a valid Class C commercial license, except as provided in subsection F of this section. Any person holding a valid Class C commercial license shall be permitted to operate motor vehicles in Classes C and D, except as provided for in paragraph 4 of this subsection.

4. No person under twenty-one (21) years of age shall be 17 licensed to operate any motor vehicle which is required to be 18 placarded for hazardous materials pursuant to 49 C.F.R., Part 172, 19 subpart F, except as provided in subsection F of this section; 20 provided, a person eighteen (18) years of age or older may be 21 licensed to operate a farm vehicle which is required to be placarded 22 for hazardous materials pursuant to 49 C.F.R., Part 172, subpart F, 23 except as provided in subsection F of this section. 24

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- 5. A person at least seventeen (17) years of age who
 successfully completes all examinations required by law may be
 issued by Service Oklahoma:
- a. a restricted Class A commercial license which shall
 grant to the licensee the privilege to operate a Class
 A or Class B commercial motor vehicle for harvest
 purposes or a Class D motor vehicle, or
 b. a restricted Class B commercial license which shall
- 9 grant to the licensee the privilege to operate a Class
 10 B commercial motor vehicle for harvest purposes or a
 11 Class D motor vehicle.
- 12 6. No person shall operate a Class D motor vehicle unless the
 13 person is sixteen (16) years of age or older and holds a valid Class
 14 D license, except as provided for in Section 6-102 or 6-105 of this
 15 title. Any person holding a valid Class D license shall be
 16 permitted to operate motor vehicles in Class D only.

17 C. Any person issued a driver license pursuant to this section 18 may exercise the privilege thereby granted upon all streets and 19 highways in this state.

D. No person shall operate a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle without having a valid Class A, B, C or D license with a motorcycle endorsement. Except as otherwise provided by law, any new applicant for an original driver license shall be required to successfully complete a written examination, vision examination and driving

1 examination for a motorcycle as prescribed by the Department of Public Safety, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma, and a certified 2 state-approved motorcycle basic rider course approved by the 3 Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma, if the applicant 4 5 is seventeen (17) years of age or younger to be eligible for a motorcycle endorsement thereon. The written examination and driving 6 examination for a motorcycle shall be waived by Service Oklahoma 7 upon verification that the person has successfully completed a 8 9 certified Motorcycle Safety Foundation rider course approved by the 10 Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma.

Except as otherwise provided by law, any person who lawfully 11 Ε. 12 possesses a valid Oklahoma driver license which is eligible for 13 renewal shall be required to successfully complete a written examination, vision examination and driving examination for a 14 motorcycle as prescribed by the Department, in conjunction with 15 Service Oklahoma, and a certified state-approved motorcycle basic 16 17 rider course approved by the Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma, if the person is seventeen (17) years of age or younger to 18 be eligible for a motorcycle endorsement. The written examination 19 and driving examination for a motorcycle shall be waived by Service 20 Oklahoma upon verification that the person has successfully 21 completed a certified Motorcycle Safety Foundation rider course 22 approved by the Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma. 23

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1 F. 1. Any person eighteen (18) years of age or older may apply 2 for a restricted Class A, B or C commercial learner permit. Service Oklahoma, after the applicant has passed all parts of the 3 examination for a Class D license and has successfully passed all 4 5 parts of the examination for a Class A, B or C commercial license other than the driving examination, may issue to the applicant a 6 commercial learner permit which shall entitle the person having 7 immediate lawful possession of the commercial learner permit and a 8 9 valid Oklahoma driver license or provisional driver license pursuant to Section 6-212 of this title to operate a Class A, B or C 10 commercial motor vehicle upon the public highways solely for the 11 purpose of behind-the-wheel training in accordance with rules 12 promulgated by the Department. 13

This commercial learner permit shall be issued for a period 2. 14 as provided in Section 6-115 of this title of one hundred eighty 15 (180) days, which may be renewed one time for an additional one 16 hundred eighty (180) days; provided, such commercial learner permit 17 may be suspended, revoked, canceled, denied or disqualified at the 18 discretion of the Department, with notice to Service Oklahoma, for 19 violation of the restrictions, for failing to give the required or 20 correct information on the application or for violation of any 21 traffic laws of this state pertaining to the operation of a motor 22 vehicle. Except as otherwise provided, the lawful possessor of a 23 commercial learner permit who has been issued a commercial learner 24

permit for a minimum of fourteen (14) days may have the restriction requiring an accompanying driver removed by satisfactorily completing a driver's examination; provided, the removal of a restriction shall not authorize the operation of a Class A, B or C commercial motor vehicle if such operation is otherwise prohibited by law.

No person shall apply for and Service Oklahoma shall not 7 3. issue an original Class A, B or C driver license until the person 8 9 has been issued a commercial learner permit and held the permit for at least fourteen (14) days. Any person who currently holds a Class 10 B or C license and who wishes to apply for another class of 11 12 commercial driver license shall be required to apply for a 13 commercial learner permit and to hold the permit for at least fourteen (14) days before applying for the Class A or B license, as 14 applicable. Any person who currently holds a Class A, B or C 15 license and who wishes to add an endorsement or remove a restriction 16 17 for which a skills examination is required shall be required to apply for a commercial learner permit and to hold the permit for at 18 least fourteen (14) days before applying for the endorsement. 19

4. A commercial learner permit shall be issued by Service
Oklahoma as a separate and unique document which shall be valid only
in conjunction with a valid Oklahoma driver license or provisional
driver license pursuant to Section 6-212 of this title, both of
which shall be in the possession of the person to whom they have

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been issued whenever that person is operating a commercial motor
 vehicle as provided in this subsection.

5. After one renewal of a commercial learner permit, as 3 provided in paragraph 2 of this subsection, a commercial permit 4 5 shall not be renewed again. 1 by the last Federal Decennial Census or the most recent annual estimate provided by the United States Bureau of the Census. 2 The funds shall be used for the purpose of constructing and maintaining 3 county highways; provided, however, the county treasurer may deposit 4 5 so much of the funds in the sinking fund as may be necessary for the retirement of interest and annual accrual of indebtedness created by 6 the issuance of county or township bonds for road purposes. 7 Such deposits to the sinking fund shall not exceed forty percent (40%) of 8 9 the funds allocated to a county pursuant to this paragraph.

F. 1. The following percentages of the monies referred to in subsection A of this section shall be remitted to the county treasurers of the respective counties and by them deposited in a separate special revenue fund to be used by the county commissioners in accordance with paragraph 2 of this subsection:

- a. from October 1, 2000, until June 30, 2001, two and
 fifty-three one-hundredths percent (2.53%),
 b. for the year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June
- 1830, 2002, two and fifty-six one-hundredths percent19(2.56%),
- c. for the year beginning July 1, 2002, through the year
 ending on June 30, 2015, two and fifty-nine onehundredths percent (2.59%),
- d. for the year beginning July 1, 2015, through the year

Any amounts 4 5 in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the credit of the General Revenue Fund, and 6 for the year beginning July 1, 2019, and all 7 e. subsequent years, two and fifty-nine one-hundredths 8 9 percent (2.59%), but in no event shall the amount apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this 10 subparagraph exceed the total amount apportioned for 11 the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts 12 in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the 13 credit of the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver 14 Safety Fund created in Section 1521 of Title 69 of the 15 Oklahoma Statutes. 16

2. The monies apportioned pursuant to subparagraphs a through e 17 of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall be used for the primary 18 purpose of matching federal funds for the construction of federal 19 aid projects on county roads, or constructing and maintaining county 20 or township highways and permanent bridges of such counties. The 21 distribution of monies apportioned by this paragraph shall be made 22 upon the basis of the current formula based upon road mileage, area 23 and population as related to county road improvement and maintenance 24

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costs. Provided, however, the Department of Transportation may
 update the formula factors from time to time as necessary to account
 for changing conditions.

G. 1. The following percentages of the monies referred to in
subsection A of this section shall be transmitted by the Tax
Commission to the various counties as set forth in paragraph 2 of
this subsection:

- a. from October 1, 2000, until June 30, 2001, three and
 fifty-five one-hundredths percent (3.55%),
- b. for the year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002, three and fifty-nine one-hundredths percent (3.59%),

Any amounts 21 in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the 22 credit of the General Revenue Fund, and 23
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1 for the year beginning July 1, 2019, and all e. 2 subsequent years, three and sixty-two one-hundredths percent (3.62%), but in no event shall the amount 3 apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this 4 5 subparagraph exceed the total amount apportioned for the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts 6 in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the 7 credit of the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver 8 9 Safety Fund created in Section 1521 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 10

The monies apportioned pursuant to subparagraphs a through e 11 2. 12 of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall be transmitted to the 13 various counties on the basis of a formula to be developed by the Department of Transportation. Such formula shall be similar to that 14 currently used for the distribution of County Bridge Program Funds, 15 but also taking into consideration the effect of terrain and traffic 16 17 volume as related to county road improvement and maintenance costs. Provided, however, the Department of Transportation may update the 18 formula factors from time to time as necessary to account for 19 changing conditions. The funds shall be transmitted to the various 20 county treasurers to be deposited in the county highway fund of 21 their respective counties. 22

The following percentages of the monies referred to in subsection A of this section shall be apportioned to the various 2 counties as set forth in paragraph 2 of this subsection: 3 from October 1, 2000, until June 30, 2001, eighty-one 4 a. 5 one-hundredths percent (0.81%), for the year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 6 b. 30, 2002, eighty-two one-hundredths percent (0.82%), 7 for the year beginning July 1, 2002, through the year 8 с. 9 ending on June 30, 2015, eighty-three one-hundredths 10 percent (0.83%), for the year beginning July 1, 2015, through the year 11 d. ending on June 30, 2019, eighty-three one-hundredths 12 percent (0.83%), but in no event shall the amount 13 apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this 14 subparagraph exceed the total amount apportioned for 15 the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts 16 in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the 17 credit of the General Revenue Fund, and 18 for the year beginning July 1, 2019, and all 19 e. subsequent years, eighty-three one-hundredths percent 20 (0.83%), but in no event shall the amount apportioned 21 in any fiscal year pursuant to this subparagraph 22 exceed the total amount apportioned for the fiscal 23 year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts in excess 24

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1 of such limitation shall be placed to the credit of 2 the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver Safety Fund 3 created in Section 1521 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma 4 Statutes.

5 2. The monies apportioned pursuant to subparagraphs a through e 6 of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall be apportioned to the 7 various counties based upon the proportion that each county's 8 population bears to the total state population.

9 Each county's allocation of funds shall be remitted to the 10 various county treasurers to be deposited in the general fund of the 11 county and used for the support of county government.

I. 1. The following percentages of the monies referred to in subsection A of this section shall be apportioned to the various cities and incorporated towns as set forth in paragraph 2 of this subsection:

Any amounts in excess 14 of such limitation shall be placed to the credit of 15 the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver Safety Fund 16 created in Section 1521 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma 17 Statutes. 18

The monies apportioned pursuant to subparagraphs a through e 20 of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall be apportioned to the 21 various cities and incorporated towns based upon the proportion that 22 each city or incorporated town's population bears to the total 23 population of all cities and incorporated towns in the state. Such 24 funds shall be remitted to the various county treasurers for

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allocation to the various cities and incorporated towns. All such funds shall be used for the construction, maintenance, repair, improvement and lighting of streets and alleys. Provided, however, the governing board of any city or town may, with the approval of the county excise board, transfer any surplus funds to the general revenue fund of such city or town whenever an emergency requires such a transfer.

6. For the year beginning July 1, 2014, twenty percent (20%) of monies referred to in subsection A of this section shall be remitted to the State Treasurer to be credited to the County Improvements for Roads and Bridges Fund as created in Section 507 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

7. For the year beginning July 1, 2015, through the year ending 8 9 on June 30, 2019, twenty percent (20%) of monies referred to in subsection A of this section shall be remitted to the State 10 Treasurer to be credited to the County Improvements for Roads and 11 Bridges Fund as created in Section 507 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma 12 Statutes, but in no event shall the total amount apportioned in any 13 fiscal year pursuant to this paragraph exceed One Hundred Twenty 14 Million Dollars (\$120,000,000.00). Any amounts in excess of One 15 Hundred Twenty Million Dollars (\$120,000,000.00) shall be placed to 16 the credit of the General Revenue Fund. 17

8. Except as provided in subparagraph b of this 18 a. paragraph, for the year beginning July 1, 2019, and 19 all subsequent years, twenty percent (20%) of monies 20 referred to in subsection A of this section shall be 21 remitted to the State Treasurer to be credited to the 22 County Improvements for Roads and Bridges Fund as 23 created in Section 507 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma 24

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Statutes, but in no event shall the total amount apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this paragraph exceed the fiscal year limitations provided in subparagraph c of this paragraph. Any amounts in excess of the fiscal year limitations provided in subparagraph c of this paragraph shall be placed to the credit of the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver Safety Fund created in Section 1521 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes,

- for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, 10 b. (1)through the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026, the 11 Oklahoma Tax Commission shall remit twenty-five 12 13 percent (25%) of the monthly allocation, otherwise scheduled to be credited to the County 14 Improvements for Roads and Bridges Fund, to the 15 various counties of the state. The Commission 16 17 shall distribute such funds monthly to each county treasurer as follows: 18

3 SECTION 11. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1135.5, as 4 last amended by Section 23 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 782 of the 5 lst Session of the 59th Oklahoma Legislature (47 O.S. Supp. 2022, 6 Section 1135.5), is amended to read as follows:

Section 1135.5. A. Service Oklahoma is hereby authorized to
design and issue appropriate official special license plates to
persons wishing to demonstrate support and provide financial
assistance as provided by this section.

11 Special license plates shall not be transferred to any other 12 person but shall be removed from the vehicle upon transfer of 13 ownership and retained. The special license plate may then be used 14 on another vehicle but only after such other vehicle has been 15 registered for the current year with a licensed operator.

Special license plates shall be renewed each year by Service 16 Oklahoma or a licensed operator, unless authorized by Service 17 Oklahoma to be renewed for a period greater than one (1) year. 18 Service Oklahoma shall notify by mail all persons issued special 19 license plates. The notice shall contain all necessary information 20 and shall contain instructions for the renewal procedure upon 21 presentation to a licensed operator or Service Oklahoma. 22 The license plates shall be issued on a staggered system. 23

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1 Service Oklahoma is hereby directed to develop and implement a 2 system whereby licensed operators are permitted to accept applications for special license plates authorized under this 3 section. The licensed operator shall confirm the applicant's 4 5 eligibility, if applicable, collect and deposit any amount specifically authorized by law, accept and process the necessary 6 information directly into such system and generate a receipt 7 accordingly. For performance of these duties, licensed operators 8 9 shall retain the fee provided in Section 1141.1 of this title for registration of a motor vehicle through June 30, 2025. The licensed 10 operator fees for acceptance of applications and renewals shall be 11 12 paid out of the Tax Commission Reimbursement Fund. Beginning 13 January 1, 2023, Through June 30, 2025, the licensed operator fees for acceptance of applications and renewals shall be paid out of the 14 Service Oklahoma Reimbursement Fund. Beginning July 1, 2023, fees 15 shall be retained by the licensed operator pursuant to subsection E 16 17 of Section 1141.1 of this title.

18 If fewer than one hundred of any type of special license plates 19 authorized prior to January 1, 2004, are issued prior to January 1, 20 2006, Service Oklahoma shall discontinue issuance and renewal of 21 that type of special license plate. Any such authorized special 22 license plate registrant shall be allowed to display the license 23 plate upon the designated vehicle until the registration expiration

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1 date. After such time the expired special license plate shall be 2 removed from the vehicle.

For special license plates authorized on or after July 1, 2004, 3 no special license plates shall be developed or issued by Service 4 5 Oklahoma until Service Oklahoma receives one hundred prepaid applications therefor. The prepaid applications must be received by 6 Service Oklahoma within one hundred eighty (180) days of the 7 effective date of the authorization or the authority to issue shall 8 9 be null and void. In the event one hundred prepaid applications are not received by Service Oklahoma within such prescribed time period 10 any payment so received shall be refunded accordingly. 11

B. The special license plates provided by this section are as follows:

University or College Supporter License Plate - such plates
 shall be designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate
 support to any state-supported or private university or college. As
 provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected shall be
 apportioned as provided in Section 1104.1 of this title;

Environmental Awareness License Plate - such plates shall be
 designed, subject to the criteria to be presented to Service
 Oklahoma by the Department of Environmental Quality in consultation
 with the Oklahoma Arts Council, and issued to any person wishing to
 demonstrate support to implement the statewide general public
 Environmental Education Program created pursuant to the provisions

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1 of the Oklahoma Environmental Quality Code. Such plates shall be 2 designed and issued to any person in any combination of numbers and letters from one to a maximum of seven, as for personalized license 3 plates. A dealer's license plate issued pursuant to Section 1116.1 4 5 or 1128 of this title may be designated an Environmental Awareness License Plate upon payment of the fee imposed by this section and 6 any other registration fees required by the Oklahoma Vehicle License 7 and Registration Act. As provided in this section, an amount of the 8 9 fee collected shall be apportioned pursuant to Section 1104.2 of this title; 10

Firefighter License Plate - such plates shall be designed 11 3. 12 for any career or retired firefighter, volunteer or paid. Firefighters may apply for firefighter plates for up to four 13 vehicles with a rated capacity of one (1) ton or less or for a 14 motorcycle upon proof of a fire department membership by either an 15 identification card or letter from the chief of the fire department. 16 Retirees who are eligible for such plates shall provide proof of 17 eligibility upon initial application, but shall not be required to 18 provide proof of eligibility annually. The surviving spouse of any 19 deceased firefighter, if the spouse has not since remarried, may 20 apply for a firefighter license plate for one vehicle with a rated 21 carrying capacity of one (1) ton or less or for a motorcycle upon 22 proof that the deceased firefighter was a member of a fire 23 department by either an identification card or letter from the chief 24

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of the fire department. The license plate shall be designed in
 consultation with the Oklahoma State Firefighters Association.

As provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected
shall be deposited to the Oklahoma State Firemen's Museum Building &
Memorial Fund for support of the Oklahoma State Firefighters Museum
and the Oklahoma Fallen and Living Firefighters Memorial;

4. Wildlife Conservation License Plate - such plates shall be 7 designed, subject to the criteria to be presented to Service 8 9 Oklahoma by the Department of Wildlife Conservation in consultation with the Oklahoma Arts Council, and issued to any person wishing to 10 demonstrate support for wildlife conservation in this state through 11 12 the Wildlife Diversity Fund, provided for in Section 3-310 of Title 13 29 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Such plates may be designed and issued to any person as for personalized license plates. 14

As provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected shall be apportioned pursuant to subsection D of Section 3-310 of Title 29 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

5. Child Abuse Prevention License Plate - such plates shall be
designed, subject to the criteria to be presented to Service
Oklahoma by the Office of Child Abuse Prevention in the State
Department of Health and the Child Abuse Prevention Action
Committee, and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support
for the prevention of child abuse.

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As provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected
 shall be deposited in the Child Abuse Prevention Fund;

6. United States Olympic and Paralympic Committee Supporter 3 License Plate - such plates shall be designed and issued to any 4 5 person wishing to demonstrate support for the United States Olympic and Paralympic Committee. The plates shall be issued to any person 6 in any combination of numbers and letters from one to a maximum of 7 seven, as for personalized license plates. The plate shall contain 8 9 the official United States Olympic and Paralympic Committee logo. Service Oklahoma shall be authorized, if necessary, to enter into a 10 licensing agreement with the United States Olympic and Paralympic 11 12 Committee for any licensing fees which may be required in order to use the United States Olympic and Paralympic Committee logo or 13 The licensing agreement shall provide for a payment of not 14 design. more than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) for each license plate 15 issued; 16

7. Oklahoma History License Plate - such plates shall be
designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate interest in
Oklahoma history. As provided in this section, an amount of the fee
collected shall be deposited to the Oklahoma Historical Society
Revolving Fund to be used for educational purposes;

22 8. Historic Route 66 License Plate - such:

a. vehicle plates shall be designed to honor historic
Route 66, also known as the "Mother Road". As

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1 provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected for each vehicle license plate shall be 2 apportioned to the Oklahoma Historical Society 3 Revolving Fund to be distributed to the Oklahoma Route 4 5 66 Museum located in Clinton, Oklahoma, and motorcycle plates shall be designed in consultation 6 b. with the Oklahoma Route 66 Association, Inc. Service 7 Oklahoma shall be authorized to enter into a licensing 8 9 agreement with the Oklahoma Route 66 Association, 10 Inc., for any licensing fees which may be required in order to use the Oklahoma Route 66 Association, Inc., 11 12 logo or design. The licensing agreement shall provide for a payment to the Oklahoma Route 66 Association, 13 Inc., of not more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for 14 each motorcycle license plate issued; 15

9. Heart of the Heartland License Plate - such plates shall be designed and issued to any person wishing to honor the victims of the terrorist bombing attack on the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building in downtown Oklahoma City on April 19, 1995. As provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected shall be deposited in the Heart of the Heartland Scholarship Fund, as established in Section 2282 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

23 10. Emergency Medical Technician License Plate - such plates24 shall be designed and issued to any person who is an emergency

1 medical technician. 3. Provision for sufficient staffing, equipment, office space
 and parking to provide maximum efficiency and maximum convenience to
 the public;

4 4. Obtainment of a faithful performance surety bond as provided5 for by law;

5. That the applicant has not been convicted of a felony and7 that no felony charges are pending against the applicant;

That the location specified in the individual's application 8 9 for a license to operate a designated Service Oklahoma location not be owned by a member of Service Oklahoma or an employee of Service 10 Oklahoma or any person related to a member of Service Oklahoma or an 11 12 employee of Service Oklahoma within the third degree by 13 consanguinity, marriage, or adoption and that the location not be within a three-mile radius of an existing licensed operator unless 14 the applicant is assuming the location of an operating licensed 15 operator; 16

That a single website, designated by Service Oklahoma, will
be used for the distribution of services provided by Service
Oklahoma with motor vehicle services to be fulfilled by licensed
operators;

8. That licensed operators will attend all required training
 provided by Service Oklahoma; and

9. That there should be at least one Service Oklahoma locationin each county.

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1 B. 1. Any person making application to the Service Oklahoma Operator Board for the purpose of obtaining a license to operate a 2 designated Service Oklahoma location shall pay, when submitting the 3 application, a nonrefundable application fee of One Hundred Dollars 4 5 (\$100.00). All such application fees shall be deposited in the Oklahoma Tax Commission Revolving Fund. Beginning January 1, 2023, 6 all such application fees shall be deposited in the Service Oklahoma 7 Revolving Fund. 8

9 2. Any person making application to the Service Oklahoma Operator Board for the purpose of obtaining a license to operate a 10 designated Service Oklahoma location must meet standardization and 11 branding requirements established by the Service Oklahoma Operator 12 13 Board, upon recommendations from Service Oklahoma. Upon approval, the person must either pay a fee to Service Oklahoma for all costs 14 related to meeting the standardization and branding requirements or 15 obtain approval from the Service Oklahoma Operator Board that the 16 17 location meets all standardization and branding requirements. All such fees shall be deposited in the Service Oklahoma Revolving Fund. 18 The amount of the license fee will be determined by the Service 19 Oklahoma Operator Board. C. Upon application by a person to serve as a licensed
operator, the Service Oklahoma Operator Board is authorized to make
a determination whether such person and such location meets the

A licensed operator may be permitted, upon application, 4 D. 1. 5 to sell or transfer an existing license to operate a designated Service Oklahoma location. Any sale or transfer of a license is 6 subject to approval of the Service Oklahoma Operator Board. 7 In order to sell or transfer an existing licensed operator license, the 8 9 licensed operator shall meet the following guidelines and 10 requirements:

- a. the licensed operator shall be in good standing withthe Service Oklahoma Operator Board,
- b. the licensed operator shall have held a licensed 13 operator license, issued by the Service Oklahoma 14 Operator Board, for a minimum of five (5) years, and 15 the licensed operator shall provide the Service 16 с. Oklahoma Operator Board evidence that the proposed 17 buyer or transferee of the licensed operator licensee 18 meets the qualifications and requirements set forth in 19 subsection A of this section, has the ability to meet 20 all financial requirements and terms of any current 21 existing contract between the licensed operator and 22 Service Oklahoma, and agrees to the onboarding and 23 training requirements of Service Oklahoma, as 24

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established by Service Oklahoma and the Service Oklahoma Operator Board.

The purchase price of a licensed operator license shall be 3 2. agreed upon by the licensed operator and the individual purchasing 4 5 the license to operate a designated Service Oklahoma location. However, the purchaser or transferee agrees to pay a transfer fee to 6 Service Oklahoma in the amount of three percent (3%) of the last 7 annual gross revenue from fees retained at the Service Oklahoma 8 9 location to be purchased, not to exceed Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00). The transfer fee shall be deposited in the Service 10 Oklahoma Revolving Fund. 11

3. Upon receipt of the application to sell or transfer an existing licensed operator license, the Service Oklahoma Operator Board will determine whether the licensed operator license may be sold or transferred on the condition that the existing location is in good standing and the new licensee meets the requirements outlined in Section 1140 et seq. of this title.

4. The Service Oklahoma Operator Board may, at its discretion, buy back a licensed operator license from a licensed operator who desires to sell or transfer its licensed operator license but has held a licensed operator license issued by Service Oklahoma for less than five (5) years. The purchase price for such a license will be one-half (1/2) times the most recent annual gross revenue from fees retained of that Service Oklahoma location, not to exceed Two

Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00). <u>The purchase price shall be</u> <u>paid out of the excess funds available in the Licensed Operator</u> <u>Performance Fund, created in Section 3-106 of this title, after</u> <u>distribution to licensed operators, pursuant to Section 3-106 of</u> this title.

E. 1. Licensed operators shall be subject to all laws relating
to licensed operators and shall be subject to removal for cause by
the Service Oklahoma Operator Board. Any action taken by Service
Oklahoma to revoke a license shall be pursuant to and in accordance
with the provisions of the Administrative Procedures Act. For the
purposes of this section, "for cause" shall be defined as follows:

- a. repeated violations of written contracts, rules,
 regulations and statutes pertaining to licensed
 operators after written warning by the Service
 Oklahoma Operator Board and an opportunity to correct

In the event of revocation, the licensed operator shall sell his or her license to operate a Service 14 Oklahoma location to Service Oklahoma at a rate of one-half (1/2)15 times the most recent annual gross revenue from fees retained of 16 17 that Service Oklahoma location, not to exceed Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00). The purchase price shall be paid out of the 18 excess funds available in the Licensed Operator Performance Fund, 19 created in Section 3-106 of this title, after distribution to 20 licensed operators, pursuant to Section 3-106 of this title. 21 F. All licensed operators shall be licensed by and under the 22

supervision of Service Oklahoma; provided, any agent authorized to

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1 shall also be under the supervision of the Corporation Commission, 2 subject to rules promulgated by the Corporation Commission pursuant to the provisions of subsection E of Section 1166 of this title. 3 Service Oklahoma shall be the holder of all licenses and has the 4 5 right to approve and revoke such licenses. The licensed operators shall charge only such fees as are specifically provided for by law, and all such authorized fees shall be posted in such a manner that any person shall have notice of all fees that are imposed by law.

8 I. Any licensed operator shall be responsible for all costs 9 incurred by Service Oklahoma when relocating an existing Service 10 Oklahoma location. The Service Oklahoma Operator Board may waive 11 payment of such costs in case of unforeseen business or emergency 12 conditions beyond the control of the licensed operator.

J. Any existing contracts by or between any motor license agent 13 and the Oklahoma Tax Commission shall be assigned to Service 14 Oklahoma. All existing motor license agents in good standing with 15 the Oklahoma Tax Commission will be offered a subsequent contract 16 17 from Service Oklahoma to become a licensed operator to take effect on January 1, 2023. The contract between existing motor license 18 agents and Service Oklahoma shall be agreed to no later than 19 December 31, 2022. Beginning July 1, 2023, through June 30, 20 2025, Three Dollars and fifty-six cents (\$3.56) for each special 21 license plate issued pursuant to Sections 1135.1 through Section 22 1135.7 of this title; 23

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3. One Dollar and twenty-five cents (\$1.25) for each
 certificate of title issued for boats and motors pursuant to the
 Oklahoma Statutes;

4 4. For each certificate of registration issued for boats and
5 motors pursuant to the Oklahoma Statutes, an amount determined
6 pursuant to the provisions of subsection B of this section;

7 5. Two Dollars and twenty-five cents (\$2.25) for each 8 certificate of title issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Vehicle License 9 and Registration Act. Provided, the fee retention amount for 10 certificates of title issued pursuant to the provisions of 11 subsection H of Section 1105 of this title, in which an insurer pays 12 the optional twenty-two-dollar-fee amount, is Four Dollars and fifty 13 cents (\$4.50);

6. Beginning October 1, 2000, three percent (3%) of the vehicle 14 excise tax collected pursuant to Section 2103 of Title 68 of the 15 Oklahoma Statutes. Beginning July 1, 2001, each licensed operator 16 17 shall be entitled to retain three and one hundred twenty-five onethousandths percent (3.125%) of the vehicle excise tax collected 18 pursuant to Section 2103 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 19 Beginning July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2023, and for all subsequent 20 $years_{r}$ each licensed operator shall be entitled to retain three and 21 twenty-five one-hundredths percent (3.25%) of the vehicle excise tax 22 collected pursuant to Section 2103 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma 23 Statutes. However, beginning July 1, 2003, the Legislature shall 24

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1 annually review the percentage to be retained by the licensed 2 operators pursuant to this paragraph to determine whether such 3 percentage should be adjusted;

Four percent (4%) of the excise tax collected on the
transfer of boats and motors pursuant to the Oklahoma Statutes
through June 30, 2025;

8. Two Dollars (\$2.00) for each driver license, endorsement,
identification license, or renewal or duplicate issued pursuant to
Section 6-101 et seq. of this title through June 30, 2023;

9. Two Dollars (\$2.00) for the recording of security interests
 as provided in Section 1110 of this title;

12 10. Two Dollars (\$2.00) for each inspection conducted pursuant 13 to subsection L of Section 1105 of this title;

14 11. Three Dollars (\$3.00) for each inspection conducted
15 pursuant to subsection M of Section 1105 of this title;

16 12. One Dollar (\$1.00) for each certificate of ownership filed 17 pursuant to subsection R of Section 1105 of this title;

18 13. One Dollar (\$1.00) for each temporary permit issued 19 pursuant to Section 1124 of this title;

20 14. One Dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) for processing each
21 proof of financial responsibility, driver license information,
22 insurance verification information, and other additional information
23 as provided in Section 7-602 of this title;

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1 15. The mailing fees and registration fees provided in Sections
 2 1131 and 1140 of this title;

3 16. The notary fee provided in Section 1143 of this title;
4 17. Three Dollars (\$3.00) for each lien entry form completed
5 and recorded on a certificate of title pursuant to subsection G of
6 Section 1105 of this title;

7 18. Seven Dollars (\$7.00) for each notice of transfer as
8 provided by subsection B of Section 1107.4 of this title;

9 19. Seven Dollars (\$7.00) for each certificate of title or each
10 certificate of registration issued for repossessed vehicles pursuant
11 to Section 1126 of this title;

12 20. Any amount specifically authorized by law to be retained by 13 the licensed operator for the furnishing of a summary of a traffic 14 record;

15 21. Beginning July 1, 2009 and through June 30, 2023, each 16 licensed operator shall also be entitled to a portion of the 17 penalties for delinquent registration or payment of excise tax as 18 provided for in subsection C of Section 1115, subsection F of 19 Section 1132 and subsection C of Section 1151 of this title and of 20 subsection A of Section 2103 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

21 22. Beginning January 1, 2023, each licensed operator shall be 22 entitled to retain Three Dollars and fifty-six cents (\$3.56) for 23 each electric vehicle registered pursuant to the provisions of this 24 act and such amount shall be in addition to any other amount

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otherwise authorized by this section to be retained with respect to
 a vehicle though June 30, 2025; and

3 23. Beginning January 1, <u>2023 and through June 30</u>, 2023, each 4 licensed operator shall be entitled to retain three and twenty-five 5 hundredths percent (3.25%) of the vehicle excise tax collected 6 pursuant to Section 2103 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes for 7 each electric vehicle but such amount shall not be in addition to 8 any other amount otherwise authorized by this section to be retained 9 with respect to a vehicle.

10 The balance of the funds collected shall be remitted to Service 11 Oklahoma as provided in Section 1142 of this title to be apportioned 12 pursuant to Section 1104 of this title.

For Through June 30, 2025, each certificate of registration 13 Β. issued for boats and motors, each licensed operator shall be 14 entitled to retain the greater of One Dollar and twenty-five cents 15 (\$1.25) or an amount to be determined by Service Oklahoma according 16 to the provisions of this subsection. At the end of fiscal year 17 1997 and each fiscal year thereafter, Service Oklahoma shall compute 18 the average amount of registration fees for all boats and motors 19 registered in this state during the fiscal year and shall multiply 20 the result by six and twenty-two one-hundredths percent (6.22%). 21 The resulting product shall be the amount which may be retained by 22 each licensed operator for each certificate of registration for 23 boats and motors issued during the following calendar year. 24

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1 C. When an application for registration is made with Service 2 Oklahoma, the Corporation Commission or a licensed operator, a registration fee of One Dollar and seventy-five cents (\$1.75) shall 3 be collected for each license plate or decal issued. Such fees 4 5 shall be in addition to the registration fees on motor vehicles and when an application for registration is made to the licensed 6 operator such licensed operator shall retain a fee as provided in 7 Section 1141.1 of this title through June 30, 2023. Beginning July 8 9 1, 2023, the fee shall be retained by the licensed operator pursuant 10 to subsection E of Section 1141.1 of this title. When the fee is paid by a person making application directly with Service Oklahoma 11 12 or the Corporation Commission, as applicable, the registration fees 13 shall be in the same amount as provided for licensed operators and the fee provided by Section 1141.1 of this title this section shall 14 be deposited in the Service Oklahoma Revolving Fund or as provided 15 in Section 1167 of this title, as applicable. Service Oklahoma 16 17 shall prepare schedules of registration fees and charges for titles, which shall include the fees for licensed operators, and all fees 18 and charges paid by a person shall be listed separately on the 19 application and registration and totaled on the application and 20 registration. The licensed operators shall charge only such fees as 21 are specifically provided for by law, and all such authorized fees 22 shall be posted in such a manner that any person shall have notice 23 of all fees that are imposed by law. 24

1	D. Unless otherwise provided, beginning July 1, 2025, the
2	provisions related to the reimbursement, retention, apportionment,
3	or distribution of funds to or by licensed operators as outlined in
4	this section shall be retained by the licensed operator pursuant to
5	Subsection E of this section.
6	E. Beginning July 1, 2023, unless otherwise provided, licensed
7	operators compensation shall be fixed by Service Oklahoma pursuant
8	to Section 3-103 of this title.
9	1. For fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, through the fiscal
10	year ending on June 30, 2025:
11	a. licensed operators shall be entitled to retain
12	nineteen percent (19%) of all fees collected related
13	to registrations provided by the Oklahoma Vehicle
14	License and Registration Act, pursuant to subsection A
15	of Section 1132 of this title, subsection A of Section

17	of this title, and subsection H of 1140 of this title,

19	b. licensed operators shall be entitled to retain forty
20	percent (40%) of all fees collected related to the
21	issuance of Class A, Class B, Class C, and Class D
22	driver licenses, permits, and identification cards,
23	including REAL ID Compliant and REAL ID Noncompliant

1	credentials, pursuant to Section 6-101 et seq. of this
2	title.
3	2. All other fees directed by this section shall default back
4	to the apportionment outlined in Section 1104 of this title.
5	SECTION 14. REPEALER 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1132.5, is
6	hereby repealed.
7	SECTION 15. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.
8	SECTION 16. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
9	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
