**Research Analysis**

The proposed committee substitute for HB 1008 declares that Oklahomans have the right to grow vegetables on their personal property for personal consumption. The measure clarifies that cities, towns, and municipalities may limit the size and proximity of vegetable gardens to roadways or other structures for safety purposes. Regulations for water use, fertilizers, or control of invasive species are also not prohibited.
