**Research Analysis**

The floor substitute to HB 1635 modifies the definition of *hotel* by raising the required number of available rooms from four to seven or more. The measure also allows the Commissioner of Health or their designee to inspect hotels for compliance with state law and for certain items deemed necessary to safeguard the health, comfort, and safety of guests.

CHANGES IN FLOOR SUB VERSION FROM INTRODUCED:

Adds language allowing the Commissioner of Health or their designee to inspect hotels for compliance with state law.

**Fiscal Analysis**

In its current form, HB1635 increases the number of available rooms needed for an establishment to be considered a hotel from four rooms to seven, and allows the Commissioner of Health to inspect hotels. This measure is not expected to increase state revenues or state appropriations. The floor amendment does not change the fiscal impact of this measure.
