Research Analysis

The senate amendment to HB 1635 modifies the definition of *hotel* by raising the required number of available rooms from four to five or more. The measure prohibits the Commissioner of Health from adopting rules and regulations for hotels relating to the building such as the plumbing, ventilation, lighting, or construction of the building. The amendment also adds an emergency to the measure.

Fiscal Analysis

In its current form, HB1635 increases the number of available rooms needed for an establishment to be considered a hotel from four rooms to five, and prohibits Commissioner of Health from adopting rules and regulations for the construction of hotels. The amendment also provides for changes to food establishment license requirements. This measure does not mandate any action to any appropriated state agency and is not expected to impact state revenues or state appropriations.
