**Research Analysis**

The CS to HB 2002 modifies the definition of obscene material to provide that when an adult knowingly provides material that qualifies as obscene material or harmful to minors must only contain depictions or descriptions of sexual conduct which are patently offensive as found by the average person applying contemporary community standards to be considered obscene material or material that is harmful to minors. The measure provides a definition of "harmful to minors".
