Research Analysis

HB 2090, as introduced, creates a delivery service license that may be issued by ABLE to any individual, limited liability company, corporation, or partnership that is registered to do business in this state, regardless of the residency of the ownership of the entity that authorizes the licensee to deliver alcoholic beverages from a store to any person who is at least 21 years of age for the individual's personal use and not for resale. The cost of a Delivery Service License is set at \$500 annually. A delivery service licensee who is authorized by law and by contractual agreement with a grocery or convenience store licensee to deliver alcoholic beverage products to a consumer is to be held responsible for violations of alcoholic beverage laws or administrative rules of the ABLE Commission affecting his or her license privilege to deliver alcoholic beverage products to consumers.

Fiscal Analysis

As introduced, HB2090 creates a delivery service license that may be issued by the Alcoholic Beverage Law Enforcement (ABLE) Commission. The license costs \$500 annually and allows for the delivery of alcoholic beverage products. The licensing fees are to be collected by the ABLE Commission for deposit and credit to the General Revenue Fund.

Officials from the ABLE Commission have indicated that this measure will increase the number of total licenses that the agency services and does not provide for an administrative surcharge for the license that would go to the agency for the increased work load. At this time, the ABLE Commission has not yet provided an estimate of the cost required to fulfill the requirements outlined in this measure.
