**Research Analysis**

The floor amendment for HB 2110 deletes the words "naloxone hydrochloride" and replaces it with the words "opioid antagonist".

HB 2110, as amended, prevents officers from taking into custody individuals that administer opioid antagonist to themselves or anyone who reasonably appeared to be in need of emergency medical assistance due to a drug or alcohol overdose. The measure provides definitions for drug or alcohol overdose, and emergency medical assistance.

**Fiscal Analysis**

This measure provides certain protections to individuals that administer naloxone hydrochloride. In its current form, HB2110 is not anticipated to have an impact on state budget or appropriations.
