HB 2110, as introduced, prevents officers from taking into custody individuals that administer naloxone hydrochloride to themselves or anyone who reasonably appeared to be in need of emergency medical assistance due to a drug or alcohol overdose. The measure provides definitions for drug or alcohol overdose, and emergency medical assistance.
