Research Analysis

HB 2114 provides that a applicant for an Oklahoma driver license or identification card who provides an individual tax identification number at application is not to be provide with voter registration services. Service Oklahoma is to send to the State Election Board information on all applicants who have provided an individual tax identification number. The information is to be compared to with the list of registered voters of each county. The measure creates a new Class D ITIN (individual tax identification number) license. The measure provides that a person applying for a REAL ID Noncompliant driver license with an ITIN is to pay an additional \$50 to be deposited into the Service Oklahoma Revolving Fund. The measure allows a resident alien making application for a driver license to obtain the license upon providing proof that the applicant is in compliance with the income tax laws of Oklahoma. The measure allows a valid passport or passport card issued by an applicant's county of citizenship as an acceptable form of proof of identity when making application for a driver license or identification card. A person using an ITIN for application for a driver license may not be issued a commercial driver license or voter identification card. The measure limits the validity of an Class D ITIN license to 4 years.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 2114 modifies several statutes regarding the application for and issuance of driver licenses in Oklahoma, as well as voter registration. Per Service Oklahoma, the changes in this measure would result in a revenue increase of \$1.1 million in FY24 and \$1.7 million in FY25 as a result of the \$50 fee increase for driver's license applications and renewals by individuals who provide a tax ID number as proof of identity.

The primary fiscal impact of this measure would result from the adding of the "NR" designation to certain licenses and the additional reporting required to be sent quarterly to the State Election Board. Service Oklahoma has determined that these implementation and recurring costs would be minimal and the agency does not expect to request additional appropriations to cover the costs of this measure.
