**Research Analysis**

The PCS to HB 2136 allows the governing body of a city or town may authorize the concealed carry of handguns into any structure, building or office space, except the courthouse, courtroom, prison, jail, detention facility or any facility used to process, hold or house arrested persons, prisoners or persons alleged delinquent, which is owned or leased by a city or town. Municipalities may authorize certain employees or public officials of the municipality, municipal public trust, or municipal authority who possess a valid handgun license to carry a concealed handgun when acting in the course and scope of employment.
