**Research Analysis**

The Senate amendments to HB 2141 remove existing language and insert a substitute.

HB 2141 amends the Oklahoma Cosmetology and Barbering Act by adding eyelash extension application and blow-dry styling to its services. It also modifies hourly training requirements for apprenticeship and licensure. Hair braiding and shampooing services are exempted from the act. Additionally, license fees are increased by \$15, with new \$40 fees for eyelash extension, blow-drying, and makeup services. Licenses must be renewed every two years instead of annually, with corresponding renewal fees.

**Fiscal Analysis**

In its current form, HB2141 adds a number of definitions to be used in the Oklahoma Cosmetology and Barbering Act, creates certificates, and modifies fees for certain licenses and certificates. The measure also contains various changes regarding licensure requirements. The State Board of Cosmetology and Barbering is a non-appropriated state agency that relies on fee revenue for operations. This measure does not mandate any action to any state appropriated agency. As a result, HB2141 is not expected to directly impact state revenues or state appropriations.
