## **Research Analysis**

HB 2173, as introduced, increases the fee assessed on every 100 pounds of raw and Grade A milk produced in Oklahoma, from one cent to two cents. Further, the measure clarifies that a two-cent fee will be assessed on every 100 pounds of milk product imported in the state.

## Fiscal Analysis

This measure raises the fee assessed on raw milk from one-cent (\$0.01) to two-cents (\$0.02) per one hundred (100) pounds produced. According to the Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry, this raise in the fee will allow the program around inspecting such milk to be self-sufficient. This self-sufficiency of the program will not create any additional revenue nor create any fiscal impact for the state.
