Research Analysis

HB 2241 exempts all municipally owned utilities serving a population of 10,000 people or less from paying for costs related to the removal of municipally owned utilities located in public right-of-way due to state highway or turnpike construction projects.

The senate amendment restores the title to the measure.

Fiscal Analysis

This measure increases includes all municipally owned utilities, not just water in the Oklahoma Department of Transportation's (ODOT) removal and relocation costs when the services are located in a right-of-way when ODOT is working within the right-of-way. There will likely be some increase in costs to ODOT from this change as it expands the costs on ODOT to all utilities in towns under 10,000 in population per the last decennial census, instead of just water utilities. Therefore, there will likely be a fiscal impact to the state.

The Senate Amendment's restore title to the measure, and do not change the unknown, but likely fiscal impact of the measure.
