### **Research Analysis**

The CS to HB 2291 allows farm equipment, including farm tractors and other implements of husbandry that are used solely for commercial non-agricultural purposes to operate on any road or highway that is not part of the National System of Interstate and Defense Highways if the operator has obtained an annual \$200 permit from the Department of Transportation.

### **Fiscal Analysis**

HB 2291 allows farm equipment used solely for commercial non-agricultural purposes may operate on any road or highway in Oklahoma, except for highways that are a part of the National System of Interstate and Defense Highways, after receiving a permit from the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT). These permits would cost two hundred dollars (\$200.00) to obtain. According to ODOT, this permit is expected to generate approximately \$150,000 with a minimal cost to developing the permit and implanting it into the online permitting system.
