Research Analysis

HB 2426 requires every law enforcement agency in Oklahoma to adopt a written policy designed to condemn and prevent motorcycle profiling and to review and audit their existing procedures, practices, and training. The measure defines "motorcycle profiling" to mean the discriminatory use of the fact that a person rides a motorcycle or wears motorcycle-related paraphernalia as a factor in deciding to stop and question, take enforcement action, arrest, or search a person or vehicle with or without legal basis under the United States Constitution or the Oklahoma State Constitution.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 2426 requires law enforcement agencies to adopt policy pertaining to "motorcycle profiling." Per the Department of Public Safety (DPS), there is already policy in place that prevents any type of profiling for State Troopers.
