**Research Analysis**

The floor substitute for HB 2514 authorizes a student who has completed 1,000 hours of cosmetology or barber training to work as a student apprentice in a salon or barber shop under the supervision of a licensed professional with at least five years of experience. Apprentices must be paid fairly, and the State Board of Cosmetology and Barbering must outline details of such compensation.

**CHANGES IN FLOOR SUBSTITUTE FROM COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE:**

The floor substitute removes all previous massage therapy language and inserts language on cosmetology and barbering training.

**Fiscal Analysis**

In its current form, HB2514 allows a cosmetology or barber student to work as a student apprentice in a salon if they have completed 1,000 hours of instruction. The student is to work under the supervision of a licensed cosmetologist or barber with at least five years of experience, and the student is entitled to fair compensation for their work.

This measure is not expected to impact state revenue or state appropriations.
