**Research Analysis**

The subcommittee recommendation for HB 2558 requires the Office of Educational Quality and Accountability to pay up to \$750 towards the National Board Teacher Certification renewal fee for no more than 300 applicants annually.

Further, the Board is required to provide an annual \$5,000 bonus, for a period of five years, to any teacher who attains National Board Teacher Certification after July 1, 2023. The State Board must also provide an annual \$5,000 bonus to teachers who attained certification before July 1, 2023 and received an additional salary increment pursuant to the minimum salary schedule. These teachers will receive the bonus for the remaining portion of their 10-year Certification.

Lastly, the measure removes the salary increase for National Board Certified Teachers from the teacher salary schedule.

**Fiscal Analysis**

As written, the measure would reestablish the National Board Certified Teacher bonus to those who meet certain requirements in the amount of \$5,000 annually. Currently this would apply to 640 certified personnel.
