**Research Analysis**

The CS to HB 2643 establishes that a firearm, firearm part, or firearm suppressor that is manufactured in this state and remains in this state is not subject to federal law or federal regulation. A firearm, firearm part, or firearm suppressor manufactured and sold in this state must have the words "Made in Oklahoma" clearly stamped, machined or engraved on the firearm. The measure prohibits any governmental entity or officer or employee of a governmental entity from adopting any rule, order ordinance or policy that enforces a federal statute, order, rule, or regulation that regulates a firearm, firearm part or firearm suppressor if the statute, order, rule, or regulation imposes a prohibition, restriction, or other regulation that does not exist under the laws of this state.
