Research Analysis

HB 2643 creates the Firearms Manufacturing Act of 2023. The measure establishes that a firearm, firearm part, or firearm suppressor that is manufactured in this state and remains in this state is not subject to federal law or federal regulation. A firearm, firearm part, or firearm suppressor manufactured and sold in this state must have the words "Made in Oklahoma" clearly stamped on the firearm, firearm part, or firearm suppressor. If requested in writing by a citizen intent on manufacturing a firearm, firearm part, or firearm suppressor, the Attorney General shall seek a declaratory judgment from a federal district court in this state that a firearm, firearm part, or firearm suppressor that is manufactured in this state and remains in this state is not subject to federal law or federal regulation. The measure prohibits any governmental entity or officer or employee of a governmental entity from adopting any rule, order ordinance or policy that enforces a federal statute, order, rule, or regulation that regulates a firearm, firearm part or firearm suppressor if the statute, order, rule, or regulation imposes a prohibition, restriction, or other regulation that does not exist under the laws of this state. Any entity that attempts to enforce a regulation restricting a manufacturing endeavor is to be denied state grant funds. Any citizen may file a complaint with the Attorney General if the citizen offers evidence that a rule, order, ordinance, or policy that enforces federal law relating to suppressors is being enforced.
