## **Research Analysis**

HB 2739 expands the eligibility requirements for the expungement of victim protective orders by allowing the expungement of a victim protective order if the victim protective order has expired and the defendant has not had a subsequent victim protective order issued, the defendant has not been convicted of a felony offense, no felony or misdemeanor charges are pending against the defendant, and at least five years have passed since the victim protective order expired.
