## **Research Analysis**

The CS to HB 3073 criminalizes the dissemination or publishing of a digitization depicting another person's name, image, or likeness without their written consent and with the intent to cause emotional, financial, or physical harm. The penalty is established as a misdemeanor upon a first offense. A second offense is a felony punishable by up to 1 year imprisonment and a fine of \$5,000. The measure also provides that any digitization must include a disclosure that the image is a digitization. The penalty for failure to disclose is to be a misdemeanor.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

This measure creates a new misdemeanor and felony for the dissemination and publication of certain digitizations. Persons convicted of such crimes shall be guilty of a misdemeanor on first offense, and a second offense shall result in a felony punishable by no less than one year imprisonment and a fine of \$5,000.

This has the potential to create additional imprisonments for the Department of Corrections (DOC) at a marginal rate of \$16.60/day per inmate to be absorbed by existing budgetary resources, as well as generate additional revenues for the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC), however the frequency of convictions for a new crime cannot be predicted.

The CS adds language to include an additional type of digitization and does not create fiscal impact.
