**Research Analysis**

HB 3215, as introduced, modifies continuing education requirements for electrical contractors, journeymen, and apprentices effective January 1, 2026. Contractors and journeymen must complete 12 hours of continuing education every three years for license renewal. The courses must be approved by the Committee of Electrical Examiners and cover specified topics. Apprentices must complete three hours of continuing education annually for registration renewal. Continuing education is not required for apprentices who are students or enrolled in an approved course.

The measure also alters the qualifications for electrical licensing exams. A score of 70 percent or higher on each part of the exam is considered a passing score. Applicants must wait 30 days to retake the exam after each failure.

**Fiscal Analysis**

As introduced, HB3215 modifies continuing education requirements for electrical contractors, journeymen, and apprentices. The measure also modifies the qualifications for the licensing exams for electrical contractors or journeyman electricians.
