Research Analysis

The second proposed committee substitute for HB 3278 requires students to complete certain modified graduation requirements in 8th through 12th grade beginning in the 2025-26 school year The modified requirements include four units of math, with one being Algebra I and another being either Algebra II or Geometry, and nine pathway units that may include up to three elective courses and cover a variety of subjects and career paths upon selection by the district board of education. A postsecondary-approved full-time CareerTech program or locally approved science-based application course may satisfy the required physical science unit.

The measure also requires the State Board of Career and Technology Education and State Regents for Higher Education to collaborate with the State Department of Education (SDE), adopt a joint plan for ensuring academic expectations, and submit the plan to the legislature. Additionally, CareerTech programs and certain AP computer science courses are no longer required to be approved by the State Board of Education for high school credit.
