**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3361 modifies the requirements for medical marijuana packaging by prohibiting images other than the producer's business name logo and requiring the logo to be designed in a manner that is not appealing to children. Medical marijuana dispensaries that violate the provisions of this measure are subject to a Five Hundred Dollar (\$500) administrative fine, which is to be deposited into the revolving fund of the law enforcement agency responsible for the investigation.

In addition, HB 3361 directs the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority (OMMA) to promulgate rules for the return of defective or hazardous pre-packaged products. OMMA intends to utilize existing staff to establish such rules.

The increase in revenue from the administrative fine provided in the second proposed committee substitute remains dependent on the number of violations filed within a given year. There are no further considerations to the state budget as OMMA confirmed this measure is not anticipated to have a negative fiscal impact on the agency.
