**Research Analysis**

The proposed committee substitute to HB 3570 allows for the use of automatic license plate readers by law enforcement to identify stolen vehicles, vehicles involved in active investigations, vehicles associated with wanted, mission, or endangered persons, or vehicles that register as a match within NCIC or other relevant federal, state, or local databases. Automatic license plate readers are prohibited from being used to enforce state or local traffic violations. Agencies using an automatic license plate reader are required to confirm that the license plate reader system complies with Oklahoma law; establish a policy governing the readers use; and obtain a permit from ODOT if the reader is used on a state or interstate highway.
