Research Analysis

HB 3570 allows for the use of automatic license plate readers by law enforcement to identify stolen vehicles, vehicles involved in active investigations, vehicles associated with wanted, mission, or endangered persons, or vehicles that register as a match within NCIC or other relevant federal, state, or local databases. Automatic license plate readers are prohibited from being used to enforce state or local traffic violations. Agencies using an automatic license plate reader are required to obtain a permit from ODOT if the reader is used on a state or interstate highway.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 3570 allows for the use of automatic license plate readers for certain purposes and requires the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) to issue a permit to the municipal or state law enforcement agency that intends to use the reader on a state or interstate highway. If ODOT is required to promulgate rules related to this measure, the department estimates an implementation cost of Three Thousand Nine Hundred and Eleven Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$3,911.50). It is expected that ODOT would absorb this cost within current budgetary resources.
