Research Analysis

The second floor amendment to HB 3667 specifies that the court is required to compel any applicant for guardian over a proposed ward who suffers from neurological conditions, such as Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or similar developmental disabilities to complete prerequisite training unless the training is waived by the court.

The amendment requires that any person required to complete training must also submit verification or attestation of completion of prerequisite training.

The amendment also removes paragraphs 2 and 3 from pages 9-10 in Section 4.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 3667 provides training requirements, and a list of approved training programs, to be maintained by the Oklahoma Department of Human Services (OKDHS) relating to guardianship. After communication with OKDHS, suitable training programs currently exist such that only minimal implementation costs may be required. The floor amendment does not alter the fiscal impact of the measure.
