**Research Analysis**

House Bill 3667, as introduced, authorizes the court to require guardian applicants to undergo prerequisite training, with verification or attestation required before appointment. The measure requires specific training based on conditions such as Alzheimer's disease or developmental disabilities for guardians of incapacitated adults. The Department of Human Services is required to maintain an approved training program list, and any programs not included must seek approval before guardianship determination.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3667 provides training requirements, and a list of approved training programs, to be maintained by the Oklahoma Department of Human Services (OKDHS) relating to guardianship. After communication with OKDHS, suitable training programs currently exist such that only minimal implementation costs may be required.
