Research Analysis

FA 1 to HB 3777 allows a law enforcement agency to charge a record copying fee of up to \$1 per page and a video copying fee of up to \$50 when complying with the requests of a subpoena to produce certain law enforcement records.

The measure removes language relating to inspection of items at certain locations.

Fiscal Analysis

This measure modifies procedure related to criminal subpoenas. Per the amendments of this measure, upon service of certain subpoenas the demanded person is to be tendered the fees for 1 day of attendance and the mileage allowed by law. Any costs related to this are expected to be negligible and in accordance with the normal duties pursuant to the issuance of subpoenas. Therefore, in its current form, HB3777 is not anticipated to have a negative impact on state budget or appropriations.

The FA1 to this measure allows law enforcement agency to charge certain fees when complying with the requests of subpoenas. This has the potential to offset costs that result from administering the provisions of HB3777, but the fiscal impact remains minimal.
