## **Research Analysis**

The committee substitute for HB 4118 modifies the best management practices by declaring that the practices are designed to prevent poultry waste from coming into contact with waters of the state, and if contact occurs from a waste application site, the nutrient management plan requires revisions. In addition, the measure grants legal immunity to poultry integrators, employees, and contractors whose land application practices are in compliance with a state-approved nutrient management plan and is retroactive.
