## **Research Analysis**

The floor substitute to Senate Bill 1380 requires the State Commissioner of Health to revise regulations overseeing Intermediate Care Facilities for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICFs/IID). These revisions encompass various aspects, such as direct care staffing ratios and the qualifications and training of direct care staff. The bill emphasizes that these regulations must align with federal standards while acknowledging the distinctive nature of ICFs/IID settings and the requirements of the residents they serve. The measure also defines "medication preparation" as "any licensed nurse, performing duties within the scope of his or her licensure as established by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing, may prepare medications for administration including the reconstitution of said medications."

### DIFFERENCE BETWEEN FLOOR SUBSTITUTE AND ENGROSSED VERSION

The Floor Substitute adds "medication preparation" to the list of defined terms.

## Fiscal Analysis

SB 1380 directs the State Commissioner of Health to update rules governing intermediate care facilities for individuals with intellectual disabilities (ICFs/IID). Officials from the State Department of Health do not anticipate this measure, in its current form, to have a negative impact on the Department's budget, thus having no direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.

The floor substitute provides a definition for *medication preparation* within the Nursing Home Care Act, which does not affect the fiscal impact of this measure.
