Research Analysis

The FA1 to SB 141 creates within the Legislative Service Bureau the position of Capitol Liaison to the State Capitol Preservation Commission. The measure directs the Department of Public Safety to create a security plan for the Oklahoma State Capitol and Oklahoma State Capitol grounds and the Governor's Mansion and to submit the plan to the Capitol Preservation Commission every 3 years. Proposals for enhancement, modification, preservation, or restoration of the Oklahoma State Capitol and Oklahoma State Capitol grounds are to be submitted to the Liaison for submission to the Preservation Commission. The Capitol Liaison is to be the primary liaison for all tenants that occupy space in the Oklahoma State Capitol. Oklahoma Management and Enterprise Services (OMES) shall serve as the primary contact for Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) compliance for the Oklahoma State Capitol. The measure eliminates the State Capitol Repair Expenditure Oversight Committee. Additionally, the measure modifies the membership of the State Capitol Preservation Commission. The Oklahoma Arts Council is given the responsibility to acquire, maintain, preserve, or restore any state-owned art in the State Art Collection or Capitol Art Collection that is in storage or on display in the Oklahoma State Capitol, and the respective grounds.

The measure repeals:

[Title 74, Section 4107](#) relating to Accomplishment of Work and Acquisitions - Compliance With Administrative Requirements

CHANGES MADE IN THE FLOOR SUBSTITUTE:

Removes the requirement that security plan be approved by the State Capitol Preservation Commission.

Removes the Governor's Mansion and grounds from the control of the Commission.

Allows the Governor to appoint a member to the State Capitol Preservation Commission.

Fiscal Analysis

Officials from the Office of Management & Enterprise Services (OMES) have provided the following analysis on the Engrossed version of SB 141:



Officials with the Oklahoma Arts Council have expressed that their agency is currently administering and budgeting for various components that are authorized in SB141. This includes curating and caring for artwork as well as developing a security plan, however the existing budgetary resources for the provisions of this measure are either limited or allocated at \$0. The extent to which SB141 could increase costs or the need for appropriations to the Arts Council is still being determined. This information will be updated is made available by the agency.

The Floor Amendment 1 to SB141 is not likely to change the fiscal impact that was calculated for the Engrossed version of this measure, however this is yet to be confirmed by OMES and the Arts Council. This information will be updated as it is made available by the agencies.
