Research Analysis

SB 1450 relates to organized retail crime. The measure provides a definition of organized retail crime and establishes penalties for the crime based upon the value of the property stolen. If the value is less than \$15,000, the person is subject to up to 5 years in prison or up to 1 year in the county jail, a fine of up to \$1,000 or both fine and incarceration. If the value of the property exceeds \$15,000, the person is subject to up to 8 years in prison, a fine of up to \$1,000 or both fine and imprisonment. The measure also extends from 90 days to a one-year period in which the value of stolen property may be aggregated to determine the appropriate punishment. The measure also authorizes the Office of the Attorney General to employ persons to serve as Oklahoma Organized Retail Crime Task Force officers whose primary responsibility is to prevent, investigate and prosecute organized retail crime.
