**Research Analysis**

FA1 to SB 1658 adds the nonconsensual dissemination of private sexual images person under 18 years of age to the list of offenses that must be commenced prior to the 45th birthday of the victim.

The amendment modifies the amount of time for the commencing of prosecutions for the listed crimes if the victim was an adult from 12 years to 20 years.

**Fiscal Analysis**

This measure modifies the statute of limitations for certain sex crimes. In its current form, SB1658 is not anticipated to have an impact on state budget or appropriations.

The FA1 to the measure expands the list of prosecutions to include an additional offense, and modifies the time frame in which related prosecutions must be commenced. The FA1 does not create fiscal impact.
