## **Fiscal Analysis**

SB 1709 transfers the Office of Client Advocacy and the Long-Term Care Ombudsman program from the Oklahoma Department of Human Services (OKDHS) to the Oklahoma State Department of Health (OSDH). Essentially, 60 FTE and the associated \$3,053,000.00 in state appropriations for the programs will transfer from OKDHS to OSDH for a full fiscal year.
