Research Analysis

SB 1770 modifies the definition of expungement by providing that a fully sealed expunged record shall not be available to the public or to law enforcement and may only be accessible to designated employees of the OSBI for research and statistical purposes. The measure defines single source record to mean an Oklahoma criminal history record that consists of an Oklahoma arrest record only. The measure provides that if a petitioner requests expungement for multiple offenses in one county, each of which would qualify for expungement if processed sequentially, the expungements may be considered under a single petition. The measure prohibits any offense that has been expunged from being treated as a prior offense in determining the eligibility of expungement of a later offense. The measure also requires that a court which issues an order setting aside or vacating the judgment of conviction and dismisses the case with prejudice due to the individual being exonerated through DNA testing to submit a copy of the order to the OSBI.
