**Research Analysis**

The engrossed version of SB 286 requires that mechanical restraints only be used on an individual being transported by the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services or a contractor of the Department if the individual assaults or attempts to physically assault the person lawfully conducting the transportation of the individual. The measure requires that the use of mechanical restraints will only continue as needed, and that every use of a mechanical restraints, including the reasons, and the length of time, must be recorded.

**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 286 provides that mechanical restraints shall only be used on an individual being transported by the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services or a contractor of the Department if the individual assaults or attempts to physically assault the person lawfully conducting the transportation of the individual.
