**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 377 adds that being excused from jury duty to not being a citizen of the United States as a valid reason for the cancelation of voter registration and requires the court clerk in each county to provide a monthly list of all persons excused from jury duty for this reason. Per the State Election Board (SEB), the addition from this measure would result in a minimal fiscal impact to the agency.

The CCS to SB 377 adds language regarding circumstances related to undeliverable mail in regards to voter registration cards. The CCS also adds language that any voter who cancels their voter registration would be eligible to submit a new voter registration application after 60 or more calendar days have passed since the request for the cancellation. Per the SEB, this addition would have no direct fiscal or revenue considerations for the state.
