**Research Analysis**

SB 622 separates Service Oklahoma and the Office of Management and Enterprise Services. The measure provides that Service Oklahoma shall continue to carry out its statutory duties and shall succeed to any contractual rights or responsibilities incurred by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services pertaining to licensed operators. The measure provides for the voluntary transfer of employees from the Office to Service Oklahoma and redesignates the Director of Service Oklahoma as the Executive Director.

**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 622 allows for Service Oklahoma to be created into its own agency separate from the Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES). Per OMES and Service Oklahoma, this measure has no direct fiscal or revenue considerations for the state. Currently, OMES receives \$28,237,000 in appropriations to administer the duties of Service Oklahoma; this funding amount would be transferred to Service Oklahoma if it were to become its own separate agency.
