**Bill Analysis**

SB 100 requires each school district in the state to undergo a risk and vulnerability assessment Oklahoma School Security Institute or a nationally qualified risk and vulnerability assessor. The assessment shall include recommendations to increase security on school district property. Any school district that completed a risk and vulnerability assessment shall not be required to undergo another assessment for 2 years. The measure also provides that any school district applying for an Oklahoma School Security Grant Program award must complete such an assessment as well as agree to expend grant funds on items recommended by the risk and vulnerability assessment and/or to provide de-escalation and behavioral threat assessment and management training to employees. The measure also requires the report on the Oklahoma School Security Grant Program to include a list of recipients.

**CCR Changes**

The Conference Committee Report for SB 100 adds language relating to the Oklahoma School Security Grant Program as well as language relating to eligibility to apply for an Oklahoma School Security Grant Program award.
