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**Bill Analysis**

SB 1038 creates the Oklahoma Food Freedom Act. The measure exempts homemade food products produced, sold, and consumed in compliance with the provisions of the measure from state licensure and inspection requirements. Such products must be sold directly to consumers for consumption at home and must not involve interstate commerce. Additionally, any meat sold must meet the requirements outlined in the measure. Transactions must occur at a farmers market or any location mutually agreed upon by the consumer and producer. Retail space at a ranch or farm may sell homemade food for consumption on the premises as well and must post signage indicating that the product was not inspected. The measure specifies that the provisions of the measure shall not interfere with the sale of goods pursuant to the Home Bakery Act of 2013.

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
