**Bill Analysis**

SB 1053 creates a new felony for persons impersonating a supreme court justice, a district court judge, an associate district judge, a special judge, a magistrate, a clerk of the court or deputy, a notary public, a juror, or other official holding authority in order to wrongfully transfer real property which is the personal residence of another. Such persons shall be subject to a term of imprisonment not to exceed 10 years and/or a maximum fine of \$50,000.00.
