**Bill Analysis**

SB 1100 expands anti-bullying provisions of law to include online platforms. An online platform is defined by the measure as a website or online application that is open to the public, allows a user to create an account, and enables users to communicate with other users for the primary purpose of posting information, comments, messages, or images. Additionally, the measure provides that a person convicted of a crime relating to these provisions shall be subject to a maximum fine of \$200.00 and/or imprisonment in the county jail for up to 30 days. Any person convicted for a subsequent offense shall be subject to a maximum fine of \$700.00 and/or imprisonment in the county jail for up to 1 year.
