**Bill Analysis**

SB 1302 amends the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program, also known as Oklahoma's Promise. It removes a requirement that eligible students complete an additional unit or set of competencies that meets college admission requirements, which must include 2 units or sets of competencies in a foreign language or technology courses. The bill allows a student who was placed in the custody of the Department of Human Services at any time from eighth grade until his or her official date of high school graduation to enroll in the program no later than the graduation date. The measure states that the income eligibility for such students will be \$60,000.00 and be based on the income of the student, not his or her parents or legal guardians.
